


### **Mustang of the Month**

### **Recipe Corner**

### Mexican Lasagna

1 box lasagna noodles1 package Taco seasoning1 pound ground beef

2 cans refried beans ( you can substitute 1 can of beans for corn or stewed tomatoes )

1 glass of Salsa con queso cheese 1 package shredded cheddar cheese Salt, pepper, onion, garlic to taste



Butter(olive oil) a baking dish. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Cook noodles, brown ground beef and season with the taco mix ( add onion & garlic to taste )

Heat refried beans and Salsa con queso

Layer lasagna noodles in a baking dish and top with the refried beans and the salsa con queso.

Add another layer of noodles and top with the seasoned ground beef followed by half of the shredded cheddar.

Top with a final layer of noodles and sprinkle the remaining cheddar on top. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 min.

A chapter in PCMC history is about to close. Our good friends Willie and Sallie Carson will be moving on from their service to the homeless and those recently leaving shelters in the Pierce County as they close Sweet Willies' Family Support operations.

As Willie and Sallie move on to the next chapter in their lives they will spend well deserved time together traveling to see family in other

states. Club member Jolene Alpert spoke with the Carson's recently and they shared how hard this decision was and the joy that they have had working with PCMC. They thanked the club for their generosity over the years. The Carson's made it clear they have not stopped helping others in need they are just going to do it in different ways in the future.

Over the last nine years PCMC has had the pleasure of partnering with Willie and Sally Carson, in serving our Pierce County community by donating and volunteering. As we gathered for club meetings, cruises, picnics, and car shows we have collected food, furniture, school backpacks and supplies, outdoor clothing, toys and helped with preparing and delivering food boxes during the holidays to help those that need a little help. Sweet Willie's has been PCMC's focus charity with over \$16,000 donated, mostly from proceeds of our yearly car show. We would like to take this moment to thank everyone (members, sponsors and show guests) who helped make these donations a reality.

#### 2011 CHARITABLE GIVING TO THE COMMUNITY

At the recommendation of and the approval of the members at the November meeting the following 3 charities will received \$750 each to support their goals.



#### **HELPING HAND HOUSE**

HHH provides once a year rent and utility assistance to families with an eviction or utility shut off notice. Also HHH provides emergency and transitional housing. To be eligible for the program families must reside in Pierce County, have one child (17 or under) living with them. Families receive case management; attend life skills training, and assistance in seeking education and training opportunities to ensure future housing stability.

Helping families to stay in their existing communities reduces the trauma, especially for children. HHH also accepts gift cards, food, household and school supplies. PCMC looks forward to working with them in 2012.

#### **EMERENCY FOOD NETWORK**

In 2010, Pierce County food banks responded to over 850,000 visits, and provided over 14,000,000 meals. Of these site visits 41% were children under the age of 18, 17% were seniors and 50% were working households.

For every \$1 donated EFN can turn it into \$12 of food. PCMC -your \$750 translates to \$9,000 in food! PCMC plans to participate in at least one Saturday's Repack Project, watch for further information.

#### SANTA'S CASTLE

Paul Nee, Lance Smith and Jerry Murphy were pleased to present Linda Evans S.C.'s coordinator with the club check just before Thanksgiving and look forward to delivering the goodies from our Fantasy Lights Cruise Toy Drive.

Since 1994, this all volunteer and entirely funded from charitable donations organization has provided Christmas to the children of Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine and activated National Guard and Reserve families (E-5 and below) experiencing financial difficulty. Last year Santa's Castle provided gifts to 2,122 children from nearly 909 families. A volunteer "elf" greets the parent and helps them select 3 toys for each child, 2 reading books, a board game, coloring books and stocking stuffers. Each infant receives a teddy bear, handmade quilt and toy.

### **Jim Lively's Mustang Turns TV Star**


Editor's Note: a very nice write up by Jim's dad, Ron Lively, on the day in the life of a Mustang TV Star.

Thursday, October 6<sup>th</sup>, my grandson Devin and I took Jim's '69 Mustang to Mt. Vernon for an all-day video shoot on the following day.

A little background leading up to this started with Jim receiving a phone call from a lady in Mt. Vernon inquiring about the specifics of his car. She had previously called Bryan of the Mustang

Shop in Auburn and he had passed on Jim's name. After a conversation, they determined Jim's car was an exact match (with the exception of the vinyl roof) to the one her first husband had owned in the mid 80's.

(The timing of the following events are approximate; the final program will have the specifics) In the Mid 80's, she and her husband were recently married with an 18 month old daughter. He wanted to sell his '69 Mustang and one evening after dinner, he drove over to Mt. Vernon to meet someone that was interested in





She subsequently remarried and she and her new husband had three additional children. Both had searched for the car for years across the U.S. In the late 80's, the car was found in San Diego, up on blocks, in a back yard, stripped out. With matching VIN numbers, they reclaimed the car, bringing it back to Mt. Vernon and restoring it. They kept the car for a number of years and finally sold it, finding that too much emotion and memories were attached to it.

In 2005, twenty years after her first husbands disappearance, a man was arrested in Puyallup/ Sumner area on a minor violation and during an interview with a detective, out of the blue, confessed to murdering a man in Mt. Vernon in the mid 80's and taking his car. He led detectives to a logging road outside Mt. Vernon where the buried remains were found. DNA con-

firmed the remains were the first husband of the lady.



Earlier this year, the Investigation Discovery channel showed interest in producing a one-hour documentary on the events that had transpired over the twenty years and finding an identical '69 Mustang was one of the more difficult things to bring into place.

### Jim Lively's Mustang Turns TV Star (cont'd)

My grandson and I arrived in Mt. Vernon on Thursday afternoon where the Investigation Discovery channel had reserved a very nice room for us at the Hampton Inn with a good restaurant across the street. Friday morning early, we drove to a County Fire District Station about four miles out of Mt. Vernon where the day's shoot of Jim's car was to take place in the parking lot. Pouring rain when we arrived, and five minutes later a man (the Fire District Chief and current husband of the lady) arrived and moved two fire trucks out of the four-bay station.

The production crew (7 people) of the Investigation Discovery channel arrived and immediately started setting up equipment as I backed Jim's car into one of the large bays. The Primary Cameraman and the Producer did a very slow walk-around the car, pausing at times, touching the fenders and chrome lightly, squatting and looking down the sides and returning to where I was standing, the Producer said, "Beautiful, she is going to be the star of the show."



The following 12 hours involved taking every conceivable shot imaginable, both of interior

and exterior of the car. Around 11:30 the rain stopped and the sun came out and I moved the car outside with the crew moving all their equipment and cameras. Shooting continued for about thirty minutes and suddenly a deer bounded across the road and walked up to within seventy-five feet of us in the parking lot. The Producer stopped everything and had the cameras commence recording the deer. All of them talking, with excitement, of how they could use these 'deer shots' in different programs. Had to remind myself that these people were from Washington D.C. and this was probably the first deer they had seen outside of a zoo.

They turned their attention back to the Mustang and an Assistant Producer came around asking what everyone wanted for lunch. Within the hour she returned (with a virtual feast) which was laid out in the lounge area of the Fire Station. As we ate, all the DVD pin blocks (they had been continuously down-loaded to a computer as they were shot in the morning) were displayed on a 50" flat screen. Some excellent video.

An item I would like to note at this time; about a half-hour after everyone arrived that morning; three young adults (with backpacks) arrived. Two young men and a young woman, they were the actors and actress that was to portray the young married couple and a friend in the mid 80's. Investigation Discovery had hired them from Skagit Community College where they were enrolled. I was most impressed of how polite and courteous they were and every time they had a break in what they were doing, they would go into the Fire Station lounge and do homework that they removed from their backpacks. This held true after lunch was finished as they quietly picked up their books and continued on. Witnessing this can make one feel good about the future.

### Jim Lively's Mustang Turns TV Star (Cont'd)



After lunch the shooting continued with the car; a camera was mounted via three large suction cups to the driver's door, the Primary Camera man, perhaps 6'2" and 220 pounds squeezed in the back seat with a camera (I didn't think he could do it). Off they went down the road, returning in about a half-hour. The camera was removed from the door and mounted on the hood for another half-hour trip and then moved to the trunk and the process was repeated.

My amusement for the afternoon occurred prior to the first run with the camera

mounted on the door. With the young man seated behind the wheel and the young woman in the passenger seat and the cameraman crammed in the back seat, I walked over and leaned down to the window and asked him, "Ever drive one of these before?" He replied, "No Sir." I replied, "Well, first of all, it doesn't have power brakes and secondly, it may have a wee bit more power than your mother's Honda, so what I'm telling you is be careful. My son loves his Mustang and I love my son. Don't want to see anything happen to his car." The poor kid flushed beet red saying, "Oh, no Sir, I'll be real careful with it." The Producer, standing behind me, tried unsuccessfully, to stifle a chuckle. (When the video shooting was finished for the day; the young man walked to me, shaking my hand and saying, "When I finish college, first thing, I'm going to get me one of these", pointing over his shoulder to Jim's car.)

The Fire Chief and I spent the most of a very enjoyable afternoon sitting in lawn chairs watching everything transpire. Perhaps a dozen cars going down the main roadway with the drivers looking toward the Fire Station, slowed down and did a 'U' turn, coming back and pulling into the lot with the question? "What's happening?" Most all got out, kibitzing and asking about the history of Jim's car.

A very long enjoyable day; met a lot of good people and for those of you that may be interested, the program, "Stolen Voices Buried Secrets" is scheduled to be broadcast on Investigation Discovery on January 31<sup>st</sup> next year. Channel 271 on Comcast Cable, channel 223 on Click Cable. I don't know the exact time of airing.
