Recipe Corner

Beef Baked Ziti

Ingredients

12 oz uncooked ziti
2 tsp olive oil
2 clove(s) (medium) garlic clove(s), minced
1/3 pound(s) uncooked lean ground beef
1 tsp dried oregano
1 tsp dried thyme
1 tsp dried rosemary
1/2 tsp table salt
1/2 tsp black pepper
28 oz canned crushed tomatoes
1 cup(s) (shredded) part-skim mozzarella cheese



Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°F.

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and set aside.

Meanwhile, heat oil in a medium saucepan over medium heat; add garlic and sauté 2 minutes. Add beef and cook until browned, breaking up meat with a spoon as it cooks, about 3 to 5 minutes; drain off any fat and set pan back over medium heat.

Add oregano, thyme, rosemary, salt and pepper; stir to coat beef. Cook until herbs become fragrant, about 2 minutes. Add tomatoes and bring mixture to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 5 minutes.

Spoon a small amount of beef-tomato mixture into bottom of a 4-quart casserole dish (just enough to cover surface); top with half of cooked ziti. Next, layer with half of remaining beef-tomato sauce and half of mozzarella cheese. Layer with remaining ziti and then top with remaining beef-tomato sauce; sprinkle with remaining mozzarella cheese.

Bake until cheese is golden and bubbly, about 30 minutes. Slice into 8 pieces and serve. Yields 1 piece per serving. Freezes well.

***You can substitute Italian Seasoning if you don't have all the herbs.

HAPPY 20TH ANNIVERSARY PIERCE COUNTY MUSTANG CLUB



This month PCMC will celebrate its' 20th Anniversary as an active Mustang & Ford Club and it all started when....

During the summer of 1991, Bill Ochs noticed while attending Mustang car shows that at almost every show he attended, there were other people from the Tacoma/Pierce Country area. In talking with these people at the shows it was suggested that they start up their own

Mustang club. In August 1991, a group of five people got together and decided to form the Pierce County Mustang Club. Island Classic Mustang Club, Mustangs West and Salem, Oregon clubs provided copies of their club's bylaws, and between the three a framework was developed as the original PCMC bylaws.

In February, 1992 the PCMC's bylaws were registered with Washington's secretary of state's office. Membership forms were approved and club meetings were scheduled for the 3rd Tuesday of each month. The original charter members were Bill Ochs, Clinton Bearteet, Don Bearteet, Richard Coombs, Bill Norman and Ken Farthing.

1992 also saw the first official meeting of the PCMC held. Directors, secretary and treasurer were elected. And the club's first show and shine was held, no awards were given out, just a friendly get-together for people interested in Mustangs, Fords or specialty cars.

In June PCMC applied to the Mustang Club of America (MCA) for charter as an MCA Regional Club, which was granted. That same month members attended their first show and shine officially representing the PCMC and won the club's first Participation Award.

The club started inducting members meeting the requirement of 15 continuous years of membership with Lifetime Membership's in 2007. Congratulations to Clinton Bearteet, Donnie & Kim Bearteet, Alice Cline, Richard & Cynthia Coombs, Tim & Janet Gwyn, Bill Norman, Bill Ochs & Toby Borton, Ben & Michael Peters for attaining that status since then.

Earning the Mustang Club of America President's Award, based on our activities and community involvement, is an annual goal of the club and you as members can be proud to boast of our success over the years.

The club continues to actively plan and invite all Mustang owners to join in our monthly cruises, special events and gatherings as well as hosting its annual Mustang Club of American Regional show and shine. These activities are coordinated around the needs of others by collecting food, housekeeping items, winter clothing, school backpacks and supplies, toy and teddy bear drives, as well as spending time repacking bulk food into family sized quantities. PCMC has volunteered with Sweet Willie's Family Support, Puyallup Food Bank, Helping Hand House, Santa's Castle at JBLM, Emergency Food Network, St. Francis House and the Make A Wish Foundation. Additionally the club annually makes financial donations to these and other local charities.
