

St. Francis House "helping those in need"

With smiles and sincere words of appreciation the St. Francis House in Puyallup gratefully accepted the club's donation of 35 winter caps, 12 scarves, 45 pairs of child/adult gloves and 3 coats plus a donation of \$20.00 collected at the Snowmaggedon Cruise in early February.

St. Francis House offers hope and eases the hardships suffered by the poor. As part of their programs they maintain a Clothing Bank of new and gently used clothing for those families living in East Pierce County and surrounding communities. In 2011, over 2,400 households that meet or were below the federal poverty level benefited from this service. The clothing bank is set up like a department store and clients can "shop" for a designated number of items (based on size of family) at a pre-set number of times during the year. The money saved by families using the bank can then go towards food, rent and utilities.

Recipe Corner

Taco Casserole

Prep time: 10 min; Total time: 40 min Yield: 6 servings

- 24 **Tortilla Chips**, plus additional for serving
- 1 Tbs Chili Oil (or olive oil and red pepper flakes)
- 1 Onion, chopped
- 2 cloves Garlic, minced
- 1 pound Ground Beef (or turkey or Chicken)
- 2 Tbs Taco Seasoning
- 1 can Black Beans, drained
- 1 cup Salsa
- 1 cup shredded fat free or reduced fat Cheese
- Optional: Other toppings such as jalepenios, olives, etc.

Heat oven to 350.

Heat oil in a large skillet. Add the onion and garlic and sauté until soft. Add meat and taco seasoning. Cook, breaking up meat with a spatula, for about 5 minutes. Add beans and salsa. Mix well and continue to cook until salsa thickens.

Line the bottom of a large baking dish with tortilla chips, pressing down on them lightly to break them into bite-sized pieces. Spread the meat and bean mixture over the chips and top with cheese. Add sliced jalapeños or other top-pings that you want to be cooked.

Bake for 20 minutes or until cheese is melted and gooey.

Scoop up with additional chips if desired.


