PCMC Raffle Update — September





Recipe Corner

WHAT TO DO WITH ALL THAT ZUCCHINI??? WHAT ELSE....MAKE BREAD!

Set oven at 325 degrees.

Mix together 3 eggs, beaten 1 cup liquid oil 2 cups sugar 2 tsp. vanilla

Blend in 1/2 tsp. salt 1 tsp. baking soda 1 tsp. cinnamon 1 tsp. ginger 1/4 tsp. baking powder

Add to mixture 3 cups flour 2 cups grated zucchini

Grease bottom and sides of 2 glass loaf pans, Dust bottom and sides with sugar. Add 1/2 mixture to each pan and sprinkle top of batter with sugar.

Bake for 1 hour.

Makes 2 loaves. Recipe can be doubled.
