Tip of the Month

Wheel wax. I don't know about you, but I am so tired of brake dust on my wheels. I am always wiping them off. I clean my wheels, back out of the driveway to jockey cars around, and they are filthy again! I got my car detailed at Metal Magic (located on South Tacoma Way just south of 56th Street across from Austin's Pro-Max) at the beginning of July just before the Bellevue show. A week and a half later my wheels are still clean! I went back in and asked what they used.

Wheel wax is amazing for keeping the brake dust away. It comes in a small jar for \$29.95 with a sponge applicator. Use only a small amount, dry to a haze, and then wipe off. I haven't reapplied since, but the amount of dust that does collect on my wheels is minimal and my hands are no longer black when I'm done.

I purchased this car for \$500 in 1983 when I was just 16 , a sophomore at Rogers high School in Puyallup. The car had “one last final start” in it. With LOTS of TLC it became a daily driver and an ongoing father/son restoration project. This car holds many fond memories.

The Interior was originally done by me and my girlfriend, now wife of 21 years. Through all of life’s ups and downs we have managed to keep “Anthony” in the family and once again it is a father /son project for my two sons and I. Some of you know my youngest son Landon. Along the way participants attempted to answer many trivia questions specific to the areas as well as questions about the Puget Sound area in general. But more important we collected cash, 46 youth & adult coats, 18 sweatshirts and sweaters plus gloves, scarves, caps, etc...a total of over 90 items to benefit the Clothing Bank at St. Francis House in Puyallup .



A Mustang Named Anthony Written by Mr. Ronald Lively



In 1983 Jim had reached that magic age and had the sole most precious commodity in his hands that a teenager could dream of. His own personal driver's license; and \$500 dollars that he worked very hard to save.

(I had given him a 1974 Gran Torino and it had been wiped out with the first heavy frost and black ice on the way to Rogers High School shortly followed by getting hit by a drunk driver.)

Obviously the next step was to get his own car. Easy task you say, I think not. I drove him from Olympia to Federal Way and numerous points in between, looking for that 'Special One', all provided by 'hot tips' from his high schools friends. Meanwhile he was reading the classifieds (remember newspapers?) in the Tacoma News Tribune nightly and the Pierce County Herald on a weekly basis.

One evening, returning home after work, I no more than got my foot in the front door and he was already shoving a copy of the Tribune in my face, showing me the circled ad for this 'good buy' on a 1969 Mustang. After dinner, I took him and a friend over to a South Tacoma neighborhood to look at it. The car was owned by a very young couple with a small child. His first name was Anthony.

We went back out to the driveway to look at this 'good buy'. The body was reasonably straight and the interior was less than so-so. Jim said to me. "We (take note of the 'we') can fix it". I noticed the bubble-gum strategically placed at two locations on the radiator slightly oozing antifreeze and took due note of the one solitary brake cylinder out of the four that actually was working and not leaking.

It was time to end this 'car hunt' and a repaired '74 Gran Torino didn't stand a chance against a '69 mustang for a sophomore in high school. Jim was separated from his \$500 and got a worn out key (and car) in return. I followed him and his friend from South Tacoma back to South Hill in Puyallup. 30 yards from the drive way, he rolled to a stop. The engine would not turn over; made a grinding and whining sound. The three of us pushed it the last 30 yards into the drive way.

A quick look with a flash light revealed the starter hanging down at a 45 degree angle and a closer inspection revealed that it had been attached not with bolts, but with a cut-off wire coat hanger. The engine was never to run again. Thus began the long and sometimes strange odyssey of a Mustang named Anthony.

Jim and I immediately started working on the car placing it on blocks in the front driveway as we did not have a car garage at that time. Four days later I started a two-week vacation with Jim's mom and sister. He wanted to stay home and work and have time to clean up the Windsor. I didn't object; figuring every dollar he made was a dollar I didn't have to put in his 'new' Mustang.

Returning from vacation, we find Jim sick on the couch which was concerning enough but, walking through the house, the kitchen was as expected, so was the bathroom and shower. Then, I walk into the family room or, started to; the entire floor space was taken up with a completely (and I mean completely) disassembled 351 Windsor engine. All parts neatly cleaned and placed on newspaper with the part name and a corresponding number indicating the sequential step number in which it had been removed from the engine block which was also present.

It took quite a long tether to get Mom back to earth again. It worked in Jim's favor, that is, being quite sick. That's the only thing that saved him from a certain death at the hands of his Mother.

The engine rebuild began shortly after; me reading from the repair manual and Jim doing 90% of the hands on. This, I insisted.

These were good days for my son and I. A project that we were both interested in and it created a bond that has lasted a lifetime. Jim had always had two or more friends at the house at any given time and all had that common interest of cars and girls.

One of the scariest memories from that time involved the hard fuel line coming from the gas tank up to and through the driver's wheel well where it transitions to a rubber line going to the fuel pump. With the engine idling this rubber line ruptured with a tiny pin-hole leak; spraying raw gas directly on to the hot exhaust manifold which immediately burst into flames. I yanked the coil wire out to kill the engine and stuffed a large handful of old T-shirts between the exhaust manifold and the rubber line to stanch the gas flow and smother the flames. Now, 27 years later, I look at the scars on the back of my right hand and quite vividly remember the event.

I recall Jim working on his Mustang and I was sitting at the dining room table one Sunday morning drinking coffee and reading the newspaper. I heard a muffled thump along the backyard fence that separated the yard from the adjacent pasture. I got up and walked to the sliding door that led to the patio. Seeing nothing, I returned and sat down and immediately heard another thump, returning to the glass door, all seemed to be fine until I caught a glimpse of something coming over the house from the front yard and landing in the pasture. I walked to a front window and watched for a moment and Jim abruptly stood up from the engine compartment and yanked a socket off the ratchet and launched it over the rooftop. He had just bought a 101 socket and wrench set for something like \$14.95 and the sockets were stripping out as if they were made from butter. After that, I never saw the kid purchase anything less than the best quality of tools.

The interior work started and continued as money allowed. Jim and his girlfriend (now my daughter-in-law) did all of it. I remember the two of them, with the door panels laid out on the family room floor, re-upholstering them.

My one and only contribution to the interior was the driver and passenger seats. The kids had run out of material by then and I got drafted to acquire more and after numerous calls, I located a business in Everett that said they had anything I needed. A drive to Everett proved that not to be the case however, they had an outlet on the tide flats in Tacoma that had it in stock, verified by a phone call. A nice trip to Everett when I could have gotten along fine with a 20 minute drive from South Hill to the Tide Flats.

With material in hand, I convinced Jim to remove the seats and let me take them to Bates Technical College (I worked there at the time) and through a 'shop job', have the Upholstery Program redo them. The student that was assigned the work was a man in his mid-30s that was on a work-release program from McNeil Island, serving a term for repeated burglaries. I would drop by the class intermittingly to check on the progress of the upholstery job and got to know the individual a little and after a while I asked him, "You're so good at doing this; why in the world are you doing time for burglary?" With a sly smile, he responded, "Upholstery doesn't give me the 'rush' I get from burglary". Go Figure...

In 2007, the Mustang developed a leak in a power steering hose fitting. Being retired, I told Jim that I would take care of it. I removed the hose and took it to Williams Oil Filter Service, off of Puyallup Avenue in Tacoma. They did a custom job on a new hose and fittings. (I would recommend these guys to anyone). With Anthony on ramps and flat on my back, installing the new hose, the thought struck me, "I'm too old to be on my back doing this stuff... last time!"

Summer 2012, Anthony on the ramps, me on my back installing a new negative lead from battery to the starter motor. "I'm 71, this is the very, very last time I'm going to do this."...Until the next very, very, very last time.

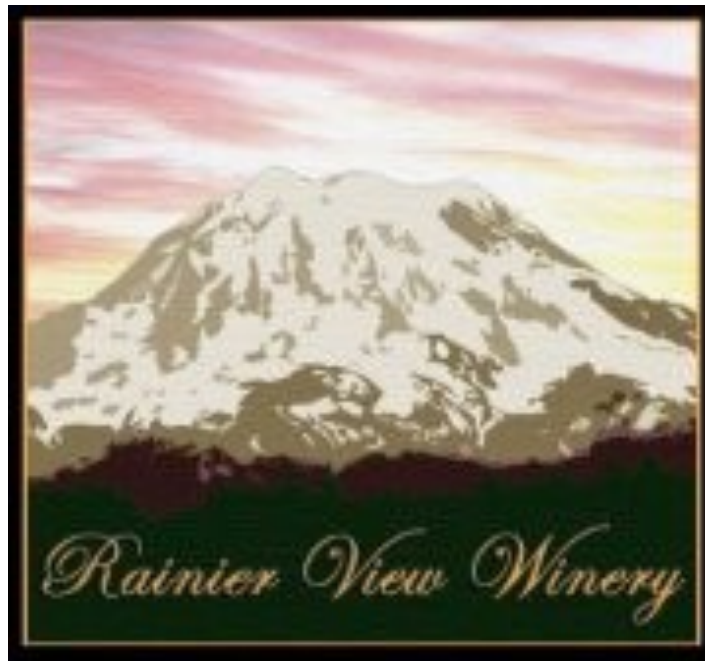
