# **Recipe Corner**



**Beef-Stuffed Zucchini Recipe**

## Ingredients

- 4 medium zucchini
- 1 Pound Ground Beef
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 3/4 cup marinara or spaghetti sauce
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/4 cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided
- Additional marinara or spaghetti sauce

## **Directions**

- Cut zucchini in half lengthwise; cut a thin slice from the bottom of each with a sharp knife to allow zucchini to sit flat. Scoop out pulp, leaving 1/4-in. shells.
- Place shells in an ungreased 3-qt. microwave-safe dish. Cover and microwave on high for 3 minutes or until crisp-tender; drain and set aside.
- Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Remove from the heat; stir in the marinara sauce, egg, bread crumbs, salt, pepper and 1/2 cup cheese.

Spoon about 1/4 cup into each shell. Microwave, uncovered, on high for 4 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Microwave 3-4 minutes longer or until a thermometer inserted into filling reads 160° and zucchini are tender. Serve with additional marinara sauce. **Yield:** 4 servings.

## Relay For Life Celebrate, Remember, Fight Back

On Friday May 17<sup>th</sup> Pierce County Mustang Club revved into Buckley to participate in the Relay For Life event. Officially12 members signed up to walk different shifts of this 18 hour overnight event but we had a turnout of 16 people with the youngest walker having just turned 2. We only had two members brave the elements for the duration but there was a larger group that stayed well past midnight. There was also one lone member who came out on a rainy Saturday at 7:30am to help relieve the two walkers that had been walking by themselves since 4am.

For those that don't know, Relay For Life is an overnight fundraiser for the American Cancer Society. It is where groups of people form teams to help raise money and awareness of what the ACS can do for those afflicted with cancer. Our club raised over \$1500 in the endeavor, with one club member earning \$596 all on her own!

We met some new faces as one new club member brought his wife out to celebrate and walk the survivor lap. We also had another member join us that day who was able to walk the survivor lap too. It is amazing to stand on the sidelines to clap and cheer as these courageous people, who have fought a serious fight, walk by in their purple shirts.

This year the theme of Relay was Making Cancer History. Going with this theme we chose to decorate our campsite in a space theme as we decided we were sending cancer to the moon. While we did not win for the best decorated campsite we did win for the best decorated garbage can. It was made into a rocket ship, complete with glowing boosters...though the inside joke was it was really a gnome.

The most touching part of the night happened at 10pm. That is when the Luminary Ceremony started. Bags had been made up with people's names that have fought cancer and either won (celebrating), lost (remembering) or are going through it (fighting back). Inside the bags candles (glow sticks) were placed, the lights around the walking area were then dimmed for an hour to let the bags glow. Stories were also shared about people that the bags were made for. Even when it was a story with a happy ending, you needed some tissue.

If you ever get a chance to go to a Relay For Life event I would strongly urge you to do it. While it is a fundraiser for a very serious disease it is a party atmosphere with music playing the whole time, activities galore and each team has a "campsite" that they decorate with a specific theme they have chosen. There is also what is called onsite fundraising where the different teams sell different things, this could be bracelets, cupcakes, or t-shirts, to different activities like a photo booth, carnival type games or face painting.



After talking to the nice folks in Steilacoom I decided to go ahead with the cruise, rain or shine.




