Recipe Corner: Bacon Explosion

Ingredients

Makes: 1 roll

- 2 pounds bacon, thick sliced
- 2 pounds sausage (Italian, breakfast, sage)
(Whichever you prefer)
- 1 cup cheddar cheese (finely shredded)
- 2 whole green onions (thinly sliced)
- 4 cloves garlic (minced)
- 1 jar barbecue rub (your favorite brand)
- 1 bottle barbecue sauce (your favorite brand)



Preparation method

Prep: 20 mins | Cook: 2 hours

1.



Take 1 to 1 1/2 pounds of the bacon and do a basket weave/lattice of bacon like the picture shown. Sprinkle the weave with some of the barbecue rub. Cook the remaining bacon until crispy. Remove the bacon from the pan and reserve the cooked bacon for the filling.

2.



On a cutting board, roll out the sausage to the same size as the weave. I use a gallon ziploc bag and leave the top open a bit so the air can escape. It makes a perfect square that will fit on your bacon weave. Cut the plastic bag away from the sausage and discard the bag. Place the sausage square on top of the weave.

Recipe Corner: Bacon Explosion (Cont)

3.



Sprinkle the crumbled cooked bacon, the cheddar cheese, garlic and the green onions over the sausage. Pour some of the barbecue sauce on top of the filling and sprinkle with more of the rub.

4.



Roll up the sausage in the bacon weave into a tight roll.

5.



Place the roll in the smoker for approx. 2 hours (give or take, depends on your heat source) or until the internal temperature reads 165 degrees F. During the last 20 - 30 minutes, baste the roll with the remaining barbecue sauce.

6.



When the roll comes out of the smoker, let it rest for 30 minutes before slicing. Serve on freshly baked biscuits.

Tip

For crispier bacon on the roll, when you remove it from the smoker, place the roll in the broiler for approx. 5 minutes to crisp up the outside then baste with the barbecue sauce.

Steamboat Springs, Co RMMR Car Show

After months of planning, prep, and reservation making, we were finally on our way, over the river and through the woods and mountain passes not all the way to Grandma's house, cause I had to be back at work on Tuesday, with both Shelby's packed for fun. Our plan was to leave after work midweek and meet up with the Freeman's in Steamboat Springs who were traveling over from Reno. Steamboat Springs is normally a ski town. You can see ski runs and lifts everywhere. But on Father's Day weekend each year it transforms into Mustang Heaven. Five area Mustang clubs pull together to put on this show. They've been doing it for 25 years. They really have it down pat.

Mustangs come from all over. Surprisingly enough, our 1,400 miles (one way) was not the farthest traveled to partake in this almost 8,000 feet elevation Mustang weekend. A Mustang from Florida took the long distance award.

Thursday morning a 43 mile Pony Trails was scheduled taking Pete and Nancy through the beautiful mountains for a peek at the countryside. Freeman's being Freeman's there was a cruise within a cruise resulting in an extra 60 miles! But they weren't the only ones to miss the turn at 3.5 miles and ended up 30 miles out of their way before doubling back.

Friday was an all day Auto-Cross; which is something like the blind-man's obstacle course we do at our picnic, but solo and without the blindfold. In a huge parking lot, a course was set up with cones marking out hairpin turns and straights. The idea was to get through the course the fastest and with hitting the least amount of cones. Very exciting to watch 4 cars at a time on the course. Dad and I were able to watch from our 3rd floor balcony. The whines from the super chargers and squeals of brakes were awesome.

Saturday was the show. All the classes, 75 in all, were divided into 2 groups, red and green for staging. We staged at 8 different time slots in the Auto-Cross lot starting at 5:30 am. Dad and I were of course in the first staging group. If you missed your time, you did not get to park with your class. Once lined up by class, we were escorted to town and into our spots for the show. We were delighted to see a familiar red Fox Body waiting on a side street to wave and take our photo. Especially nice because Pete and Nancy didn't have to stage for another hour and a half!

A total of 467 cars were in the show. The largest class was by far the 07-14 Shelby's, followed by a rather large class of '65 fastbacks. There were 40+ Shelby's at the show, including several KRs (King of the Road), SS (Super Snake), GT, GT/SC, 350, 500, and even a 1000 hp Shelby.

It was a hot, very nice day. We met lots of new people and was even able to visit with 2 of Dad's brothers that drove up for the afternoon on their Harley's.

Sunday we carted all our things down the 3 flights of stairs, packed it all up again, checked out, and headed out to breakfast at the host hotel. During breakfast several raffle prizes were given away. On our way in was a bulletin board listing winners. Pete and Nancy tied for first place in the 79-04 modified all class, and took 3rd place 79-93 combined People's Choice stock and modified class. So many beautiful cars.

Dad and I headed off for a fast trip home, while Pete and Nancy left the next day making stops in Wyoming, Utah and Oregon for more adventures. We all made it home safe, sound, and with no tickets or tours of Ford dealers along the way. A really fun show if you have the time, it's a great way to spend Father's Day.
