Mustang of the Month Scott Delano 73 Mach1 and 02 Coupe

I bought my red 2002 Mustang back in 2007 when my Nissan Maxima died on me. I bought it because I thought it looked good and I've always liked mustangs, but I didn't have many plans for it since it's just a V6. I was looking for decent fuel economy, of course. Then my friends convinced me to get the exhaust done, and then an intake, and then throttle body, and then clutch, etc etc... Next thing you know, I've got almost every bolt on you can think of, with an engine build coming down the pike. I've decided I'm going to build the car as an autocross racer, upgraded all of the suspension and drivetrain. Next, (I already have all of the parts) I'm building another 3.8L into a 4.3L stroker. It's going



to be 8.7:1 compression, fully forged, cammed, ported heads, and with a custom intake adapter plate, supercharged with an Eaton M112. With water/meth injection, I have no idea how much power it'll be able to make until the first dyno run. Hopefully it's fun for more than just the first run (and not just blow up). Styling wise, I've got a Saleen front bumper and Roush side exhaust with the skirts. The side exhaust is getting redone when I return from deployment. I just wanted what I think is the best of both brands.

As for my 1973 Mach 1, I just fell in love with the bigger cruiser type body style. Especially with how few 71-73's you see on the road, I knew I wanted one. I mean to keep it mostly stock and take it to shows and bring it out on sunny Friday nights or Sunday cruises. So far it's gotten a complete engine build, flat top pistons for higher compression, and a cam. It's got an Edelbrock intake and Barry Grant Demon on top, with Hooker Headers letting the engine exhale. Other than that, all I really want to do is shorten the rear end gears a bit to make it more fun. At 4300 lbs, I'm already quite happy that it keeps up with WRX's. The gears will be going in also when I get back from deployment. I don't plan on much else, since the Marti Report says it's a one of one Gold Glow Metallic with matching 351C and top loader 4-speed.

Recipe Corner: Jello Salad by Ruby McChesney

Ingredients

- 1 lrg (12oz) Strawberry Jello
- 2 Cups Boiling Water
- 2 10 oz Sweetened Frozen Strawberries
- 1 13 1/2 oz Canned Crushed Pineapple (Drained)
- 2 Large Diced Bananas
- 1 8oz pkg Sour Cream



Directions

1. In a Large Bowl, Dissolve Jello in boiling water, stir continuously for approx 2 min until Jello is completely dissolved.

- 2. Add frozen sweetened strawberries continue to stir
- 3. Add DRAINED can of Pineapples and continue to stir
- 4. Add Bananas and Stir
- 5. Pour 1/2 mixture in a 9x13 Pyrex dish and place in fridge to firm
- 6. Keep remaining jello at room temperature
- 7. Once Jello in pan is Firm, spread a layer of Cream cheese over it.
- 8. Place remaining Jello on the layer of Cream Cheese and place pan back in Fridge
- 9. Serve when Jello has Firmed.

raffle tickets for every jar of peanut butter they brought. Once again our club shows how big of a heart it has with 47 jars of donated peanut butter.



Hashknife Pony Express Written by Monika Kirkland

Attention Stamp collectors!!!!

While traveling with the Mustangs Across America Group in 2009 we stopped in Holbrook, AZ for the night. The Navajo County Sheriffs Posse (search & rescue team) invited us to watch a video about the Hashknife Pony Express in their small theatre. Afterwards we visited with members of the posse and it sure turned out to be an informative evening.

For over 50 years, members of the Posse, under the oldest continuous official contract with the U.S. Postal Service, has carried the mail from Holbrook to Scottsdale, via "pony express" style. 27 posse riders carry the mail from Holbrook to Scottsdale on horseback (26+ hours of continuous riding) every January.

Designated Pony Express letters are each stamped with a special cachet that is a collector's item. Letters that are mailed from the Holbrook Post Office are also stamped with an official Pony Express Station cachet.

I know it made my stamp collecting friends happy to receive such a special envelope in 2010.

Cars will need to be decorated with a minimum of 100 lights per 10 feet in length which can be easily accomplished with either the LED or Twinkle style of lights, an inverter plugged into the AC outlet or cigarette lighter for a power source. Some nylon zip ties, tape and binder clips. There are also some cool suction cup plastic light holders made for use on house windows and the like,



will also work along hood, trunk lid and doors. Look at Home Depot or Lowes for these types of accessories. Also large fabric ribbons and bows tied over and around each car's, roof, hood and trunk will meet the events decoration requirements. We should also have our antenna flags on while in the parades.

The application process requires me to submit a copy of each car's driver's license and proof of insurance card. I need to fill out 2 entries one for each city, so if there is overwhelming interest, as many as 16 to 20 cars will be able to participate between the 2 towns. If we get more 20 we will do the old draw names out of a hat to select the PCMC representatives at the September meeting.

By the way this is only open to PCMC members. If you belong to another Mustang club, your club would need to submit their own entry application.

The Sumner parade begins at 2:30pm, so we stage at the Sumner High School stadium parking about 1pm. The Puyallup Parade begins at 4:00pm, and we head straight there after completing the Sumner parade. They will send me a map and directions for the staging area for that parade later this year. Each leg lasts about an hour depending on where we are in the lineup.


