Recipe Corner: Pasta Fazool

When I was growing up in Miami, my mother (who was Italian) would sometimes make a dish she called in her Neapolitan dialect pasta fazool. In Italian it is called pasta e fagioli, which means pasta and beans. Although my mother never put sausage in hers, I prefer it that way, so here is my recipe for pasta fazool.



Heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Add two cloves of minced garlic and 1 pound of hot Italian sausage. Sauté until the sausage is brown, stirring the sausage to crumble it. Add one cup of tomato sauce and 2 cups of chicken broth and bring it to a boil.

Stir in 1 cup of small shell pasta, two cans of S&W Small White Beans (including the liquid from the cans), 1/4 cup of grated parmesan or romano cheese, $1\ 1/2$ teaspoons of dried oregano, 1/2 teaspoon of dried basil, and 1/4 teaspoon each of salt and freshly ground black pepper. If using mild Italian sausage, add 1/4 teaspoon of crushed red pepper.

Bring it back to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for about eight minutes or until the pasta is done. Let it stand for five minutes before serving.

Garnish with additional grated cheese.

Running Autocross with the Bremerton Sports Car Club Author: Tom Henderson

Have you ever thought you might like to try autocross? If you are not familiar with autocross, let me back up and explain. If you are familiar with autocross, feel free to skip this explanation. If not, read on.

Think of a road race course, but one that is setup with orange traffic cones and is about 3/4 of a mile long, more or less. It might be setup in a large parking lot or, as in the case of the Bremerton Sports Car Club (BSCC), on an abandoned runway at Bremerton Airport. One car runs through the course with no other cars around it. There will be another car that is about half way through the course before the next car gets started, but it is not like a track day with other cars around you. The typical course elements are a slalom (where a series of cones are setup in a row and you must weave through them) and a gate (where two cones are setup 10 or so feet apart and you must pass between them). There are, of course, curves in the course and you might encounter a series of gates that are offset one from the next.

The object of autocross is to get through the course as fast as you can without missing any gates or knocking over any cones. At BSCC events you incur a 10 second penalty for missing a gate and a 2 second penalty for knocking over a cone. Penalties are added to the time it took you to complete the course to determine your score for a run. You get to go out and push your car as hard as you can with no fear of running into anything (unless you go a lot crazier then anyone I have ever seen) and become more familiar with your car's limits and become a better driver in the bargain. To be really good at autocross you have to learn to look ahead and anticipate what you must do next, and this will make you a better and safer driver on the road.

One of the great things about autocross is that it is very inexpensive. To participate in the BSCC events you must join the club for the year. I believe the current cost is \$30. The registration cost for an event is also about \$30. One of the main reasons that it can be so inexpensive is that if you don't work you don't run. So you will have a period where you are running the course perhaps four or five times, and a period where you will be out on the course setting cones back up when someone has knocked one over.

If you are inexperienced at autocross (or relatively so) you will run in Novice class and there will be experienced drivers who will ride with you and coach you through the course. Once you have become an experienced driver your class may be determined by your car. There are explanations on the BSCC web site (bscc.net).

BSCC just had a Novice School on March 15th and I enrolled in it to get more seat time in my Mustang. I got some great coaching and got eleven runs. There is another Novice School on May 25th. You can learn about it by visiting their web site and there will be a link for registration if you decide to take the plunge. I can almost guarantee that once you do you will be hooked. I certainly am, and as long as I am fit enough to shag cones (the term used for standing alongside the course and setting cones back up when they have been knocked over) I will continue to participate.
