2014 CHARITIES FUNDED

Club members at the November meeting, formally adopted the following organizations to receive proceeds from the 2014 annual car show at a level of \$1,500 each.

EMERGENCY FOOD NETWORK

EFN provides more than 15.1 million healthy, nutritious meals annually at no cost to over 60 food banks, hot meal sites and shelter for distribution to low income families and individuals.

In 2013, programs in their network accommodated 1,404,755 total visits. EFN spent neatly \$1.45 per visit to assure that each time a community member walked into a food program with nothing, they walked out with enough food for 9 meals.

With an administrative overhead of under 4%, EFN distributes \$12 worth of food for every \$1 received....that means PCMC's donation of \$1,500 equals \$18,000 toward EFN's goal "that no person goes hungry.

PUYALLUP VALLEY ST. FRANCIS HOUSE

Offering hope and easing hardships of those in need in East Pierce County. They exist to improve the lives of those in need. Because we and others cared enough to support their programs many lives have been touched...here's how much!

2,500 households are served annually, approximately 7,500 young children. They, along with other nonprofits continue to work tirelessly to help the many homeless youths that find themselves on the street. They serve 16+ communities including Puyallup, those along the 512 corridor and the Salishan area. 63 families received emergency rent and utilities support to keep them warm and safe in their homes. Financial gifts prevented 34 families from becoming homeless. Over 12,000 meals are served annually to the homeless.

Caring for Kids is an all volunteer organization helping students in need in Lakewood, Joint Base Lewis McChord, Steilacoom and University Place school districts. All money and in-kind donations go directly to helping kids. They provide school supplies, clothing, hygiene and dental products, weekend bags of food, books, ready to learn materials and holiday gifts. In addition they also collaborate with the Methodist Church Friday Dinners, the Fish Food Bank and the Food Connection Food Truck in Springbrook

SANTA'S CASTLE

While not receiving a cash donation, Santa's Castle is the club's targeted charity for this year's toy drive held in conjunction with the Fantasy Lights Cruise and Holiday Gathering. Sponsored by volunteers of the 191st Infantry Brigade Santa's Castle has provided Christmas to children of Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine, Coast Guard, active National Guard and Reserve families (E-4 and below) experiencing financial difficulty since 1994. In 2013, Santa's Castle provided gifts to over 2,751 children from 1.245 families.

ADDITIONALLY, through out the year the club ties cruises and charity work together by collecting hats, gloves, coats, socks, peanut butter, 50/50 raffles, Relay for Life sponsorship, and a backpack and school supply drive. Club members continue to volunteer twice a year as part of EFN's Repack Program



Some helpful tips on "How to Plan a Cruise"

Pick a Place - It can be anywhere **YOU** want to go or share with other Mustang Friends

Examples – A long drive, bowling, mini golf, a restaurant, a museum, a park, pumpkin patch, Christmas lights, scavenger hunt, progressive dinner or an event like an apple squeeze. You can pick anything or place.

Check Availability – Make sure they are open. Make sure they know a group is coming, sometimes they will offer a discount. Check to see if it is "kid friendly", some members like to bring their kids. This will make it easier to pick a date for your cruise. Try to give a little notice so you can share at a club meeting, get in the "Pony News", on the website and for members to get on their calendar.

How are you getting there – Some places you can just meet everyone there or plan a drive to get there. If you plan a drive – pick your route; please make sure you **DRIVE** the route. This will help you find bathroom stops and see if there are any changes you might want to make.

Are You Planning a "No Host Meal" – If you are having a meal, please give the restaurant a few days notices. This makes it easier for them to have the staff scheduled. Check for "Kid Friendly".

Make a Flyer – Make sure you have the basic info – Place, Meeting Location, Leave Time, Date, Time, Cost, Contact Info, and What is happening – i.e. if you plan on collecting items for a charity, or "No Host Lunch". If any part of your event is **NOT** "Kid Friendly", please state that. Make sure the "Pony News" editor, Face-Book, Membership for an alert, and the Website get a copy.

Extras – Printed Driving Directions or Navigation Devices are helpful. You can add Trivia Questions, A Quiz, Prices, or Raffles for example. You can make dash plaques, in the past members have used the regular dash plaques, some have been creative with packages of hot chocolate, or apples, or paper leaves, or paper

horses, even a compass. You can also collect items for our charities – gloves, scarves, hats, socks, and food items - anything.

Incentive – Piece County Mustang Club will help with up to \$100 to set up a cruise. You must show receipts to be reimbursed. This is to help with anything – dash plaques, raffles, shoe rentals, printing. PCMC will not cover more than \$100, so watch what you spend. Some members have been able to set up a cruise without using the incentive, but it is available if needed.

HELP – If you need any help, please ask. Most of our members would be willing to go on a test run or help with a route or give some guide lines or feedback.

Please Note – You don't need to follow these tips, planning a cruise can be lots of fun and very simple – it is inviting your friends to join you on your adventure.

The design was based on the fastback Mustang models of the late 1960s which Ford referred to as "retro-futurism." It was the first to offer the "Pony Package" which allowed V6 owners to include a "GT inspired" suspension, larger wheels and tires, custom grille and more.
