I bought the car 10 years ago from a guy at work. It was in rough shape but it was all there, all stock but someone had cut the dash and it had a slide in radio.

I started disassembling the car and found a lot of rust so I changed the left and right quarter panels, cut the vent cowl apart to repair the rust. This was my first attempt to replace a body panel. It was a lot of work, but I learned more about how the car was assembled at Ford. I welded in a new repair



panel for the radio and repaired the dash. I recovered the seats and installed new carpet, door panels, dash pad, and all new chrome outside.



Now to body and paint. That was a long and miserable journey.

I had done some trade work for the paint job that didn't work out so well for me. He got his work done, I got jacked around for years...I finally gave up and went to John Booth at Creative Concepts. It was a 3 year process but it was finally done.

Thanks to my wife Vickey and my family for putting up with all the time and parts everywhere, and my friend and neighbor Charlie for all his help.

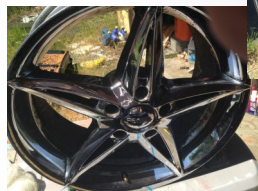
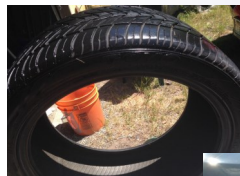

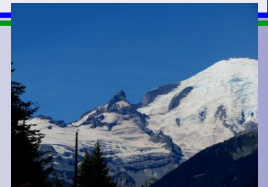

August 1st

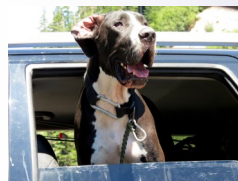

Our Money to a Good Cause

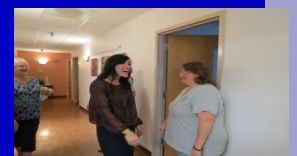
At our car show on August 9, 2015, our members, participants,

A few foul balls came our

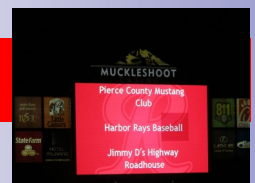
