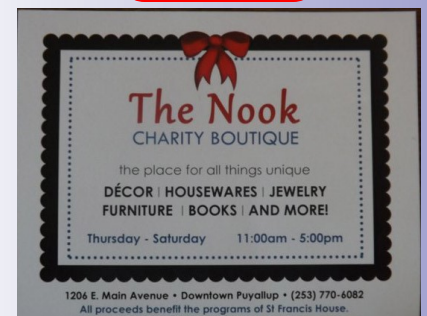
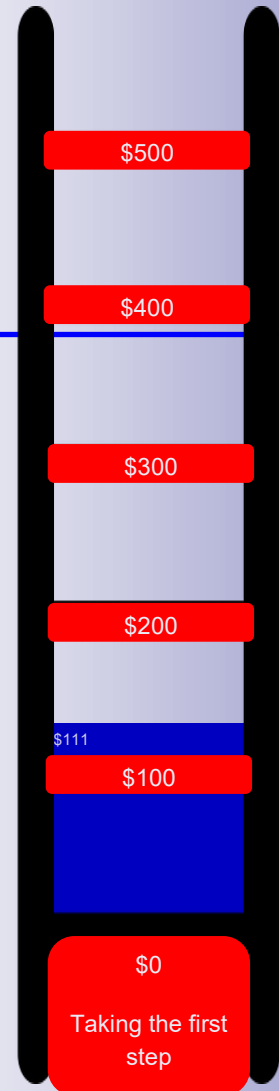

2001 True Blue "Sleeper" V6 Coupe



In September 2015 I was looking for a new vehicle to replace my Dodge Durango 5.9L (pre-Hemi but still a lot of fun);

which I lost due to an accident months earlier by no fault of my own. I started searching around for used Challengers, Mustangs, and other sports cars.

I'll be honest, being an avid Mopar man, I was leaning towards the Challenger until I spotted the Mustang at a used car dealer's lot near my house. I noticed it was a nicely maintained and slightly custom Mustang with Elvis Presley signature series front seat covers with matching floor mats, chrome Cobra Head shifter head as well as matching valve stem caps.

I kept an eye on it for a couple of weeks via the internet and made several trips to the dealer's lot for test drives. I also test drove other cars to throw them off and to stop them from try to get me to buy it. After all, it was still priced too high (\$7K) even for a low mileage V6 Mustang (72K miles).

Over those few weeks the price had dropped a

thousand dollars. Even though Blue Book suggested retail range was \$3,800-\$4,300, I went back intent on buying it but not for the sale price of \$5,999. I had just received the settlement from the accident and knew with "cash in hand" I could get a good deal. So I went to the car lot with my brother as a buffer.

I ask the salesman what would he take for it on an all cash deal and he replied "Why don't I make this easy on you. How much are you willing to spend?" I informed him of numbers from Blue Book and offered \$4,200.00 which he told me he couldn't do. I mentioned again the "cash in hand deal" but he said he didn't care either way how he got the money (cash or finance) but I commented back that this deal was less waiting for approval of the loan (if it went through) and less paperwork. He countered with \$5000.00. I quickly did the math in my head and told him I would accept his offer if the \$5,000.00 was "out the door price". Amazingly he accepted.

As he was writing it up I asked what was the base price, he kind of grimaced, and said "\$4,283". That made me smile. I only paid \$83 over my original offer. This is my daily driver at the moment but I'm making it a "Sleeper V6" for some sporty fun.

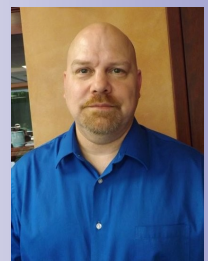

Informational Article: Judged Show Prep

Well, we just did our first judged show in June. What an adventure. We traveled to Reno with 4 other club cars and one that met us there.

Traveling with club members was fun. We got to know them better while enjoying the company of fellow car/Mustang enthusiasts. The sights were gorgeous and yes...Nancy shoots photos out the car window of just about everything. (no that isn't correct....of everything)

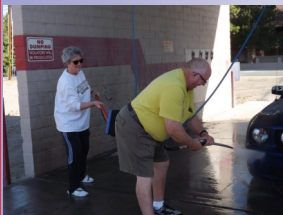


What did we learn?

There is a lot of work that goes into detailing a car for a judged show. Some like it and some do not. Clean and detail before you go but take all your supplies with you as you will be doing it again and

again and maybe again.

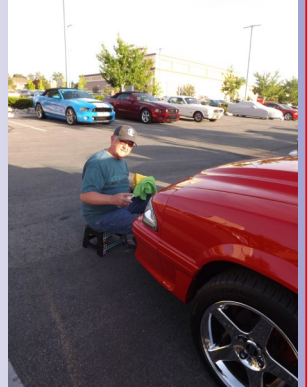
- Travel to the show and then wash off the bugs.
- See local sites before and after the show as there is little time for moving the car once the show starts.
- Take plenty of towels for drying and cleaning.
- Have a large supply of gloves to keep the prints off when detailing.
- Have a variety of sizes of soft paint brushes, tooth brushes, etc with the metal edges wrapped with tape. These are for those tiny, hard to get places inside the engine compartment and in the interior.



- Clean everything....even those spaces you wouldn't normally think to clean like the door hinges, vents, console and glove compartment.
- Be prepared to do all this several times. We were fortunate and got judged right away. Some got judged after wind had unloaded the first round of pollen and others not until the next day. It rained overnight adding to

the process for all. Just be prepared and be patient.

- Take plenty of water and sun screen. Of course this depends on the time of year and location but from where I was sitting, Reno on the asphalt is HOT!



We found people at the show incredibly friendly and helpful. While everyone was cleaning they would share tips and sometimes products that they found use-

ful. In our case they helped us see streaks that we had missed or that we caused in the cleaning process.

We must say that we learned a lot and will never look at cleaning the car quite the same after this experience.

Everyone has to help!

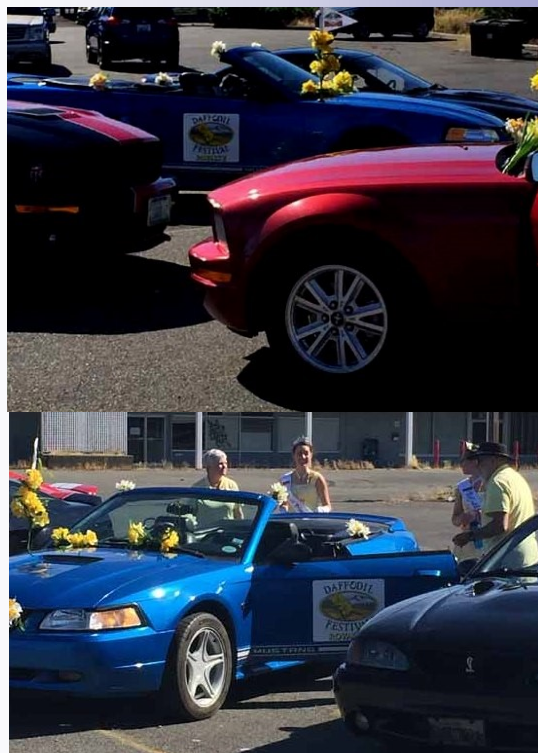
Duck Parade

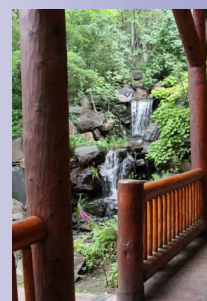
While some of our ponies were quacking through University Place, others were on a drive through the beautiful mountain ranges of Oregon and California

In Memory of "Duke Robbins" by Greg Robbins

My father grew up in the late 50's ~ early 60's. This was the start of the modern car culture. As I grew up, I would listen to his stories of the cars he had and how he would modify them to go faster or look better. His favorite was his 56 Merc with a flathead V8 and shaved door handles, Persimmon and White. I heard stories of street races and cruising.

When I was about 10 he bought a 1969 Ford Bronco. We would take it all over the mountains of Northern California. I can remember crossing streams so deep water was coming into the cabin. Us kids probably logged 50,000 miles in the back of the Bronco. One of the first modifications to the

Bronco was the installation of a roll bar with 2 inches of foam padding to protect our heads as we bounced around in the back.

Each year we would pack our camping gear and head down to the sand dunes at Pismo Beach for the Forth of July weekend. Each year he would push that Bronco to its limits on the sand and inevitably, something would break. That meant, get it home and make it bigger and stronger.

My dad's final years were spent in Reno, Nevada and he would always talk about the Hot August Nights Car Show. His love of everything cars is why this sponsorship is in his honor. He would have loved to be involved in this club with me. – Greg Robbins

NEW MCA MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS!

The Mustang Club of America has implemented new "Tiered Membership" options as a way for Mustang enthusiasts to choose the level of involvement and benefits from their MCA membership. Previously, only one membership level was available. Now there are three pricing levels—Associate, Digital, and Standard.

Associate Membership: At \$25 annually, Associate members have access to MCA vendor benefits, including the Ford X-Plan and the MCA website. Associate members may also enter MCA National and Grand National shows but do not have access to the digital or hardcopy issues of *Mustang Times*. Associate members may not vote or hold MCA Regional or National office. The price of an Associate Membership is the same for all members, regardless of where they live in the world.

Digital Membership: The \$35 annual Digital Membership includes all the benefits of the top-tier Standard membership except these members will not receive a mailed copy of the printed *Mustang Times*. Instead, Digital Members will have access to the digital edition through the MCA website. The price of a Digital Membership is the same for all members, regardless of where they live.

Standard Membership: Standard Membership is the "old" \$50 per year MCA membership but with the added benefit of accessing the digital *Mustang Times* in addition to receiving a subscription to the printed magazine via mail. The price of a Standard membership is higher for members living outside the United States due to the added postage cost of mailing the *Mustang Times* magazine to addresses outside the United States.

Frequently asked questions:

Can current (Standard) members change to an Associate or Digital Membership? Or can Associate or Digital Members change to a higher level membership? Yes to both. Members are free to change the

level of their membership. There are two ways to do this. At the time of membership renewal (within 30 days of the membership end date), members can use the online renewal function on the website to choose the new level of membership. If a member wants to change the level of membership at a time other than renewal, they should contact Kristie at the MCA office (850-438-0626 or mcaofficemanager@gmail.com) and she will manually change the membership level. If a member wishes to switch to a higher priced membership, the additional cost will be collected at the time of the upgrade.

If I change to a lower-priced membership level in the middle of my membership term, will MCA refund the cost difference? MCA will not issue refunds for mid-term membership level reductions. However, we will be happy to extend the expiration date of your membership with any excess funds.
