In 1984 I was a student in a business school trying to get my life back together, and then "it" happened. I saw a student, a blonde, get into her 1965 Mustang red convertible. I was hooked. Luann and I merged our families together and raised our three perfect children. Like so many other young families we had to sacrifice our Mustang, but we never forgot or gave up on our pony car love affair. I became a truck driver, we moved to Cushing. OK. Luann got a job at Oklahoma State University Veterinary Teaching Hospital. We bought a 40 acre ranch raised meat goats, cattle and horses. Our kids were in 4-H and FFA. James is a Vietnam vet, and he had to go help. In 2009 James had a bad day in Mozul, Iraq. He shattered both of his ankles and left heel which left him 100% disabled.

Sooo, we went through a major change of life. Luann went back to school and became a nurse. I became a domestic engineer. We sold our ranch, auctioned off all the livestock and ranch equipment. A very sad day. 2012 we went to a Leake car auction in Tulsa, OK. We found and bought a 1965 "C" code Mustang Vintage burgundy convertible. Nice looking basic pony car. When we received the registration paperwork we found out that the car had come out of a car museum and had 28,000 original miles and was numbers matching. Luann's skill as a Mustang fan, gave us back our first love. Also for fun, we bought a 1979 Mercedes 450SL with a beautiful yellow color. Our daughter called and asked us to move up to Tacoma where she was living with four of our grandchildren. She was divorcing her husband and needed our help and support. 2013 we moved, bought a house in Lakewood. 2015 we went to the PCMC car show at Lakewood Ford enjoyed looking at all the Mustangs that were there that day. We had been talking about the 50th anniversary Mustang for a long time. It was exciting to

actually see them there at Lakewood Ford. I was looking at the Limited Edition 2015 and was wanting to talk to Luann about it but she was looking at the 2015 GT 50th Anniversary Edition Mustang with a beautiful Deep Impact Blue color. She looked at me and said " you better buy me this car or else I'm going to have to steal it.. one way or another it is going home with me.". So "Uncle Bob" gave us the keys and said we needed to take a test drive. Luann took the keys jumped into the driver seat and off we went on the 512 freeway for a little test drive. Luann Is 5'2" with a 6' attitude and a lead right foot. She stepped on the gas and we were going 90mph before you can say yee ha. We were both hooked and now this beautiful fun car is in our garage with her older sister "the bookends" we call them. We love all the new technology in the 2015 all the bells and whistles.

Ford dealerships along the way which is good news as it meant there was no need to stop for repairs.




