





Vote for Club Positions for 2017

By-laws as They Pertain to Duties of Elected & Appointed Positions

ARTICLE VII. - Duties of Officers/Directors/Appointed Positions

Section 1. PRESIDENT:

- A. Approval and payment of such indebtedness and expenses necessary to carry on the business and activities of the PCMC as presented by the treasurer.
- B. Conduct, oversee and guide the general business affairs of PCMC and other such business activities approved by the membership.
 - C. Hold and preside over monthly meetings.
- D. Act as the official spokesperson for the purpose of representing PCMC to the media, other clubs or organizations unless the president specifically assigns another PCMC officer or director this duty.

Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT:

- Assist president as needed.
- B. Help conduct, oversee and guide the general business of the PCMC.

Section 3. SECRETARY:

- A. Take minutes at regular or special membership meetings and Board meetings. Also maintain a record of such minutes.
- B. Handle any and all correspondence. Share responsibility of post office box and key with club treasurer, forwarding to the appropriate officers/chairman any related written correspondence.

Section 4. TREASURER:

- A. Collect all money due PCMC.
- B. Pay from the treasury all debts and expenses directed by the officers of PCMC.
- C. Keep records of all PCMC monetary business.
- D. Report the financial status of PCMC at each membership or Board meeting.
- E. All checks or other drafts of payments shall be signed by the treasurer and one Board member as listed on bank signature card.
- F. Share responsibility of post office box and key with club president, forwarding to the appropriate officers/chairman any related written correspondence.

Section 5. DIRECTORS:

- A. Chair committees and help with PCMC business.
- B. Assist the PCMC Officers and help oversee PCMC activities.

By-laws as the pertain to Article VII (continued)

Section 6. APPOINTED POSITIONS

Individuals shall be appointed by the Board on a voluntary basis to fill unspecified terms of office for the following positions:

- A. Newsletter Editor. Publishes a monthly newsletter of events, past, present, future, and notice of club meetings and activities. Provide notice of the availability of the newsletter to PCMC members, sponsors and other recorded car clubs.
- B. Web-Master. The Web-Master shall maintain the website (www.piercecountymustangclub.com) with current information paralleling closely that of the monthly newsletter. The web-master is not responsible for pursuing content, only maintaining the website. Information updates shall be left to the discretion of the webmaster, but shall be updated at least twice monthly as needed.
- C. Event Coordinator. Plans PCMC events or outings. Organizes and follows through the event. Orders trophies, plaques, prizes, etc. and necessary advertising material or materials needed to put on the activity. Furnishes the Newsletter Editor and web-master with information in a timely manner.
- D. Technical Workshop Coordinator. Plan and schedule technical workshops in the care and maintenance of Mustangs or Ford.
- E. Annual Car Show Chairperson. This person or persons are responsible for planning, organizing and coordination. They will provide monthly updates to the Board and to the club's general membership. Maintain possession of 1 of 2 storage shed keys.
- F. Storage Shed Manager. Shall track disbursement and return of club equipment. Monthly maintenance of generator and moisture control reimbursement for said supplies. Maintain possession of 1 of 2 storage shed keys.
- G. Membership Coordinator. Issue membership cards and update club rosters (current year & cumulative). Send welcome packets to new member(s). Forward new member information to newsletter editor and club president. Maintain a list of member e-mails to use to inform/remind members of upcoming events.
- H. MCA Regional Director. Coordinates communication between PCMC and Mustang Club of America. Encourages MCA membership and provides updated member list each January. Insures there are a least 10 MCA members in order to maintain our position as an active regional club of the MCA is responsible for all insurance applications, completes annual MCA report, updates MCA website with current PCMC officer list, registers annual car show. Applies for annual MCA President's Award.

Section 7. The Board may also appoint committees for specific events or activities or other matters for organizational purposes.


After dinner the winds had picked up, some de-





The paperwork will be submitted November 12th so, if you're like me, you can't wait for Saturday, December 3rd to arrive. What a fun day the Santa parade is.


You must have at least 100 lights on your car to enter.
