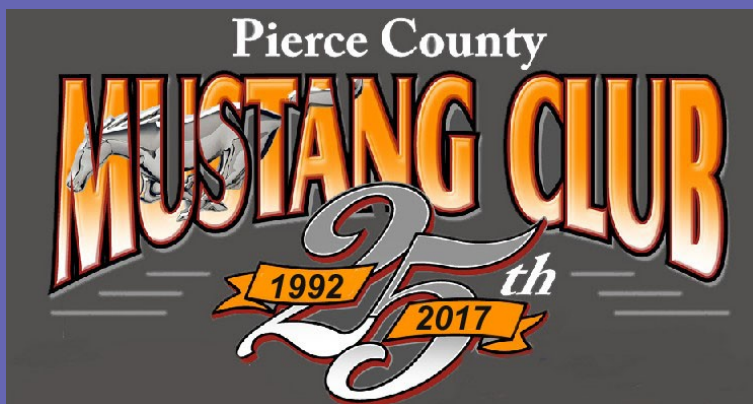

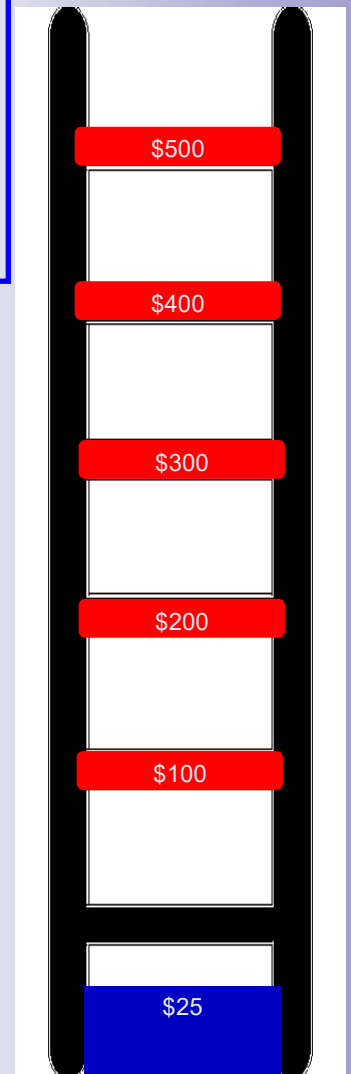

Cathy and I are very proud to be associated with you all .

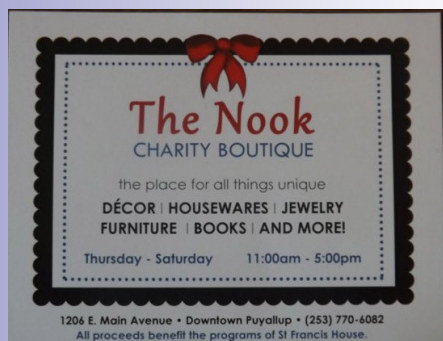

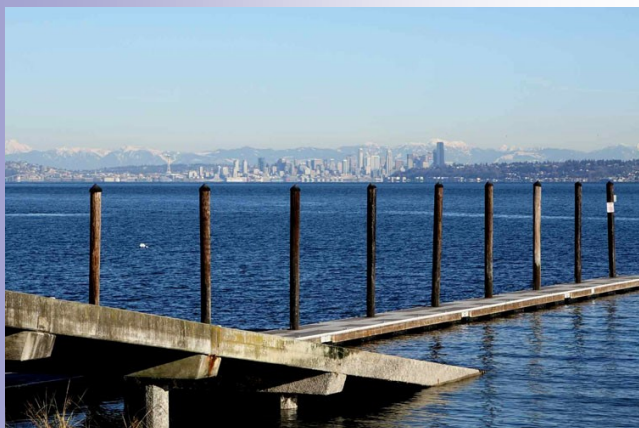

Informational Article: Happy 25th!

History of Pierce County Mustang Club

So what were you doing 25 years ago? I recently heard someone say they bought their first Mustang in 1992. I heard someone else say they just started their business.

In February of 1992 "I'm Too Sexy" by Right Said Fred is #1. The 16th Winter Olympics opens in Albertville, France. Michael Johnson sets world 400m indoor record, 44.97 sec. (It took me that long to type his record)

Some of us were going to the movies and we might have seen: Aladdin, A Few Good Men, Wayne's World, Sister Act or Unforgiven. Some stayed home to watch Oprah, America's Funniest Home Videos, Home Improvement or Married...with Children. Or if you were into music you might have listened to Pearl Jam, Peter Gabriel, Metallica, Michael Jackson, Toad the Wet Sprocket or Billy Cyrus's Achy Braky Heart. (<http://www.thepeoplehistory.com/1992.html>)

While some were paying attention to those items above, a group of Mustang owners got together to form a car club full of Mustang owners and so was the beginning of the Pierce County Mustang Club. Here is our great club's story.

During the summer of 1991, Bill Ochs noticed while attending Mustang car shows that at almost every show he attended, there were other people from the Tacoma/Pierce Country area. In talking with these people at the shows it was suggested that they start up their own Mustang club. In August 1991, a group of five people got together and decided to form the Pierce County Mustang Club. Island Classic Mustang Club, Mustangs West and Salem, Oregon clubs provided copies of their club's bylaws, and between the three a framework was set up for the PCMC bylaws.

In February 1992 the PCMC's bylaws and membership forms were approved and club meetings were scheduled for the 3rd Tuesday of each month. The original charter members were Bill Ochs, Clinton Bearteet, Don Bearteet, Richard Coombs, Bill Norman and Ken Farthing.



March 1992 The first official meeting of the PCMC was held. Directors, secretary and treasurer

were elected. The year ended with a club membership of 32. Many thanks are due to Albert Thomas as the designer of the club's original logo.



April 1992 The club invited others to a friendly get-together for people interested in Mustangs, Fords or specialty cars

June 1992 PCMC applies to the Mustang Club of America (MCA) for charter as an MCA Regional Club, which was granted (2/9/1993). That same month members attended their first show and shine officially representing the PCMC.

1993 PCMC hosts the first of many annual show and shines.

June 1994 PCMC wins its' first Club Participation Award. Membership totals 90.

1997 PCMC donates \$500 to the Mustang Museum, becoming a "Cobra" participant in the Founding Club Sponsors (#79).

2000 PCMC joins the internet world by hosting it's first website.

2007 The club started inducting members meeting the requirement of 15 continuous years of membership with Lifetime Membership status.

2012 PCMC celebrated its 20th Anniversary as a club and as a Mustang of America Regional Club. Earning the Mustang Club of America President's Award, based on our activities and community involvement, is an annual goal of the club and we are proud to boast of our success many times over. (see our web page for our awards)

The club continues to actively plan and invite all Mustang owners to join in our monthly cruises, special events and gatherings as well as our annual Mustang Club of America Regional Show and Shine. These activities are coordinated around the needs of others by collecting food, housekeeping items, winter clothing, school backpacks and supplies, and toys. Many volunteer hours are spent repacking bulk food into family sized quantities. Significant financial donations are made annually. Over the years PCMC has supported Sweet Willie's Family Support, Puyallup Food Bank, St Francis Helping Hand House, Santa's Castle at JBLM, and Emergency Food Network. We have recently added The Tears Foundation.
