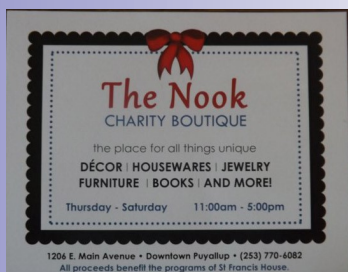

317 pounds !!!

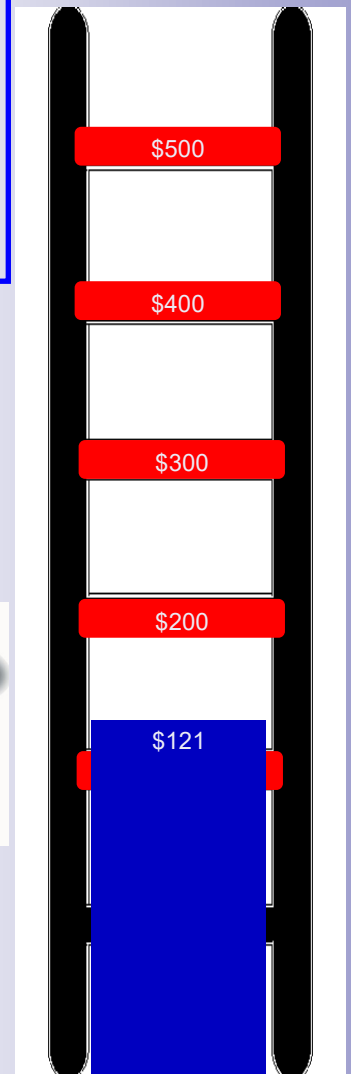


We sure did! Another job well done by our club members. That gave Korum 1,517 pounds to give to the Puyallup Food Bank.

Informational Article: How to Earn that Pretty Grille Medallion

To be awarded a Mustang Club of America national winner grille medallion you must meet the following criteria:

Enter and have your car carefully judged against a set of standards, about 5 pages of them in the modified class.

Earn a minimum of 20 points since 1997.

National: 2 points are awarded for a gold and 1 point for a silver. Grand National: 3 points are awarded for gold and 2 points for a silver.

So it is just that simple. Just go to the show, do "some" cleaning and polishing (make that hours and hours), earn the points, fill out the form, and provide proof of points earned.

Here is Koolrde's story...

In 2009, Pete and Nancy Freeman left to take a trip to a MCA show in Van Nuys, California. Sometime during the show they were bitten by the Medallion Bug. This is a small metallic bug that gets under the skin and can't be removed without many miles of travel. But with an excited whinny from Koolrde the adventure began.



As most of you know Koolrde is not a trailer queen and every one of the 33,660 miles were on her own hoofs. Along the way she was challenged by chipmunks who wanted to



play chicken, a stop in the forest brought out butterflies to admire her red coat. Surrounded by a herd of bison she matched their steely glares. She rested in stalls while her riders rode a ferris wheel on top of a 10 story building, hiked many a national park trail, walked under the thundering noise of Niagara Falls,

rode down a river and any other thrill they could find.

Sometimes Koolrde enjoyed the company of other Mustangs in the herd as other PCMC members joined in the fun. But most of the time she was on her own traveling the switchbacks up and down mountain passes, one as high as 11,000 feet, galloped along most of Route 66, she endured dust storms, cleansing rain, snow, hail, the blazing heat of the desert and endless view of corn fields in the Midwest.

She remained calm and cool depending on her pal "GPS," when her riders decided to take cruises with-in cruises, to get them on the right trail again or when a side trip to a Ford dealership was needed to fix a hurt.

In May of this year, Koolrde, Pete, and Nancy were presented at the MCA national show in Tucson, Arizona with a Red (modified/non-concours) Grille Medallion. Lady-like snorting and pawing the ground, Koolrde says "where to next?" Answer....MCA grand national in Kansas.

Pete and Nancy, thank you for sharing your story. Koolrde, thanks for holding up through it all!

In the News

Trying to keep up with the Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

- In the latest issue of ***Mustang Times***, Donald Farr reports that one of the two 1968 Mustang fastbacks from the movie *Bullitt* was found. This Highland Green fastback was the “jumper” in the movie according to Farr and his research and driven by Steve McQueen.
- According to Jeff Peek in the ***Hagerty Newsletter*** of April 24, 2017 Mustang 100002 will/ was up for sale at Mecum in May. First hardtop and first 6-cylinder Mustang. In the article Peek reports that “Mecum’s pre-auction estimate...is \$450,000 to \$650,000” for this Mustang #2 (first one is in the Henry Ford Museum). What an investment, about “22 to 32 times” the Hagerty valued price for a ‘65 Mustang Coupe of this type and condition. By the way, it is Caspian Blue. Check out Hagerty for more about this vehicle. Wish I had a couple of extra bucks sitting around!
- In the same ***Hagerty Newsletter*** this time April 26th, Mike Bumbeck reports about the beginning of the 428 Cobra Jet. Tasca Ford dealership did the work to create a competitive pony car with a powerful engine. It was the KR-8 and when Ford produced it, became the 428 Cobra Jet. According to Bumbeck, Ford sent 10 early production Cobra Jet Mustangs in white to Bob Tasca who “weighed all 10 and chose the two

lightest and best-running examples. One was converted by Holman-Moody into the 11-second Tasca Ford Cobra Jet Super Stock drag car; the other became the unbeatable “Street Bertha.” More information in the ***Hagerty Newsletter***. Cool stuff.”

Monika and Greg, thank you for planning and preparing such a fun trip. Many of us know the work that goes into planning a cruise

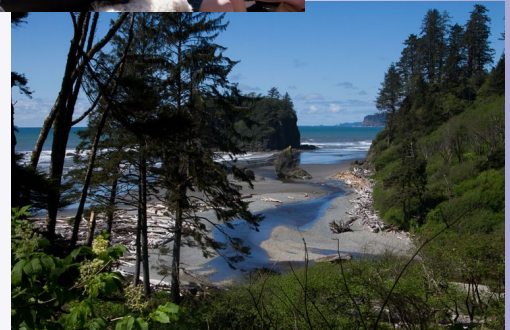
with this many cars and people, but to add staying overnight.....that just ups the challenge and the fun.


