





You folks are the most amazing people we have the privilege to call friends and not just in the Mustang world. The club put out a call for assistance and


you answered with strong backs, willing hands, tools, trucks, engineering smarts, repacking placement skills, and laughter.

engines cleaned, cars shined, and bodies prepped to put on our own event—25th Anniversary for us this year. Let's make it a great one!


