
Food Drive

From the By-Laws

ARTICLE VI. - Elected Officers/Directors

Section 1. There shall be four (4) elected Officers of PCMC:

President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer

Section 2. There shall also be five (5) Directors of the PCMC made up of the past president and four (4) members elected by ballot.

Section 3. The current president and the presidentelect shall work together to seek individual(s) to fill Officer or Director position(s) still open following the annual election.

Section 4. These Officers and Directors shall be the governing body of the PCMC, known as the Board.

Section 5. Appointed positions shall be considered exofficio members of the Board, with no voting privileges but encouraged to attend monthly Board meetings to give reports.

Section 6. All officers and directors will be expected to maintain active participation in the duties of these offices; i.e., attend and participate at meetings on a regular basis, barring extenuating circumstances. In the event an officer or director is not fulfilling their duties, a 2/3 majority vote by the general membership can remove that person from their position.

Section 7. Club president, vice president, secretary, treasurer and MCA regional director must be current Mustang Club of America members as a requirement to maintain regional club charter status.

Section 8. PCMC will pay MCA dues for all officers, directors & regional director.

ARTICLE VII. - Duties of Officers/Directors/ **Appointed Positions**

Section 1. PRESIDENT:

- A. Approval and payment of such indebtedness and expenses necessary to carry on the business and activities of the PCMC as presented by the treasurer.
- B. Conduct, oversee and guide the general business affairs of PCMC and other such business activities approved by the membership.
 - C. Hold and preside over monthly meetings.

D. Act as the official spokesperson for the purpose of representing PCMC to the media, other clubs or organizations unless the president specifically assigns another PCMC officer or director this duty.

Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT:

- A. Assist president as needed.
- B. Help conduct, oversee and guide the general business of the PCMC.

Section 3. SECRETARY:

- A. Take minutes at regular or special membership meetings and Board meetings. Also maintain a record of such minutes.
- B. Handle any and all correspondence. Share responsibility of post office box and key with club treasurer, forwarding to the appropriate officers/chairman any related written correspondence.

Section 4. TREASURER:

- A. Collect all money due PCMC.
- B. Pay from the treasury all debts and expenses directed by the officers of PCMC.
 - C. Keep records of all PCMC monetary business.
- D. Report the financial status of PCMC at each membership or Board meeting.
- E. All checks or other drafts of payments shall be signed by the treasurer and one Board member as listed on bank signature card.
- F. Share responsibility of post office box and key with club president, forwarding to the appropriate officers/chairman any related written correspondence.

Section 5. DIRECTORS:

- A. Chair committees and help with PCMC business.
- B. Assist the PCMC Officers and help oversee PCMC activities.

John Gruver 1970 Red Mach 1

My car has been in a shop in Seattle for the past 18 months; I dropped it off there just a few days after I bought the car in late April of 2016. It was supposed to be done tomorrow [October 29], but once again the delivery has been delayed by a slow parts order.

As for my love of Mustangs, my mom bought a new Mustang in 1966 and I fell in love with Mustangs right away. I learned to drive in that car and when it came time for me to buy my first car, it was a 1964 1/2 Mustang. That was in 1975.

I always talked of getting another Mustang, but with a family and the need to own a work vehicle, the time for another Mustang was continually put off for many years. My wife, Patty, passed away from ovarian cancer in January of 2016. At Christmas she had given me a card with a Mustang on the front and on the inside she wrote for me to sell her car and get the Mustang I always wanted. So that spring I started shopping around for a 1969 or 1970 Mach 1, my favorite style Mustang. I found a 1970 Mach 1 with a 351 Cleveland that I really liked in April and bought it.

My new Mustang did have some issues (to say the least) so I immediately dropped it off at a shop near my office for upgraded brakes, suspension, and steering. One thing lead to another as things usually

do with a 47 year old car and after an expanded project list that included new wiring, transmission, an engine rebuild, relocating the battery to the trunk, a fair amount of new sheet metal, and a list way too long for this story, its finally ready to leave the shop's garage and come to my garage in Puyallup. Or at least it should be by next Tuesday [October 31].

It still has a long list of projects to go, but it is now a good "driver" to say the least.

In the News

Trying to keep up with the Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

From *Mustang Times:* (October Issue)

- GT350R—In 1965 these vehicles were originally built. Three of the original builders, referred to as the "Original Venice Crew," have agreed to build them again. Just as in 1965, they will build 36 of them. They will start with 1965 K-Code Mustang donor cars and recondition/rebuild them to 1965 "competition" specs including featured designs for the '65 that were not used then because of time. They are starting production in fall of 2017.
- **2018 Good Neighbor Mode**—("Quiet Start" or "Quiet Exhaust" Modes) - This will be a steering wheel mounted thumb control that allows you to start up the GT without "sharing the experience with the neighbors." You will be able to schedule the time through a menu that has exhaust volumes of "normal," "sport," and "track."
- 2018 Ford GT—limited edition Heritage theme honoring GT40 MarkIV driven by Gurney/Hoyt in the 1967 LeMans victory coming soon.

According to American Road Magazine's Autumn 2017 issue there is a gorgeous drive just down the

road. Check out the McKenzie Highway in central Oregon. The route they describe goes from Eugene east on HWY126 toward Sisters and Redmond with a loop in the middle and from the photos, lots of tree lined, curvy roads for the Mustang to explore. Sights to see are Leaburg Dam and the Hatchery, Goodpasture Covered Bridge, Proxy Falls, the John Templeton Craig (lost postmaster) Grave, McKenzie Pass, Dee Wright Observatory and Sahali and Koosah Falls. Many of the names, AR says, come from an extinct "pidgin trade language" combining Chinook, Nootka, English, French, and other languages. Sahalie means "heaven or "high" and Koosah "named for the sky." There are 2 Hotsprings, Belknap and Terwilliger, in which to soak your weary muscles and a beautiful McKenzie Bridge Ranger Station cut in the "Oregon Rustic" architectural style.

Information Article: Emergency Kits and More

As we begin to see the storms roll in across our "neck of the woods," we have to start thinking about being prepared for the emergencies that could happen and the driving conditions.

Lets start with the car emergency kit. You can go on www.dmv.org/how-to-guides and search for emergency kits for a complete list. Here are a few of the suggestions:

- Roadside flares and triangle reflectors
- First-aid kit & Roadside emergency card
- Jumper cables
- 2 qts of oil & 1 gal. antifreeze
- Some rags and a funnel
- Extra fuses
- Phillips & flat head screwdrivers
- Adjustable wrench & vise grips
- Roll of duct take
- Roll of paper towels
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Pocket knife
- Ice scraper
- Tire pressure gauge & inflater
- A blanket
- Bottled water / energy bars
- Work gloves or latex gloves
- Several black plastic garbage bags

These are just a few of the items. The pastic bags can be used as a makeshift rain coat, ground cover to kneel on, and then all the wet and dirty towels, gloves, etc can go in them until you are home safely.

AAA also recommends, in their Nov/Dec 2017 issue of **Puget Sound Journey**, a shovel and some sand or kitty litter.

Ford has tips for driving in different weather conditions. One such condition is hail. Their first suggestion—stay home. They remind us that in some places those little hail stones can get pretty large. Although I have never seen some of those baseball size stones, I wouldn't want them hitting my car or me for that matter.

If you must go out or are already out when it hits,

they have these recommendations:

- Stay in the car
- Use low beams
- Pull over to a safe place away from poles and lights get and where car might not get hit with hail (if possible)
- Use emergency flashers
- Angle into the storm
- Cover yourself

There are other winter driving tips on Ford's site as well. Check them out.

Keeping your car in good running condition and fueled up is always a great place to start. According to AAA, winterizing your car is on top of the list. They remind us to have "oils, fluids, battery and windshield wiper blades inspected, and if necessary replaced." Other recommendations from AAA are:

- Check the tires for proper inflation
- Monitor weather and traffic before going
- Watch speed, following distances, and don't use cruise control in wet / icy conditions
- Be prepared mentally for driving—rested and sober

We all know "Murphy's Law" that whatever bad will happen, will happen at the worst possible time. You will get a flat on a single lane road, in the middle of the night, and it will be pouring down rain.

Whatever the conditions, be safe. Take care of yourself and your car. Car show season is just around the corner!



After lunch a few of us explored the Falls Park and checked out the salmon hatchery.


What a great day for a Fall Cruise to Olympia! We had 30 Mustangs start the cruise at McDonald's.





As soon as I receive the information from the Puyallup Downtown Association & the Sumner Main Street Association with staging directions, I'll get them out via email.


