

In the News and Other Information

Trying to keep up with Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

From the June Consumer Reports On Health:

From Hagerty Spring 2018 Edition:

Ok, this was new for me but maybe you already knew this. The Mustang's first race was "the 1964 Tour de France (TdF) Automobile, a 10-day, 4000-mile motorsport spectacle." IT WON! According to the article, the TdF is a tough race that in 1964 had 117 cars start and only 36 finish. It is a tour of France that includes race tracks, hill climbs and sprints. The Mustang was in the Touring class which from 1959 to 1963 had been won by Jaguar sedans. I'd say, not a bad start.

For a more current event, **Hagerty** also reports that the Mustang, which has been a pace car at the Daytona 500 in previous years. In 2019, Ford Mustang will be entered as a competitor for the first time in the Monster Energy Cup Series. The author guesses that it will be with the GT500 trim. We will all have to wait and see. NASCAR approval will occur sometime this year and the race is February 17, 2019.

Are you one who plan's ahead? The Grand Opening of the Mustang Owner's Museum and the 55 Years of Mustang Event are scheduled for April 17-20, 2019 in Concord, North Carolina.

Information Article: Question—What will power our cars in the future?

I have been wondering about this question for a while. It is a dilemma. We all want clean air and to save our natural resources. We love driving through the beautiful countryside amongst the trees, following the rivers to a gorgeous view of a magnificent mountain. And we love the rumble, rumble of our powerful engines.
