

Right "out of the gate" as they say, the cover story is the production of the 10,000,000th Mustang. What a sight! And right there with the 10,000,0000th was the 1st one ever sold with Gail Wise, the original and current owner, as well as the 1st Mustang off the assembly line. Talk about history! Here are some fun facts quoted from the article by Donald Farr:

- 29,545: Number of miles if 10 million Mustangs (average length of 15.6 feet) were pared end-toend.
- 6: Ford vehicles that have reached the 10 million mark, including the Model T and F150.

- 1.6 million: Mustangs built at the Flat Rock Assembly Plant since 2004.
- 54: Years to reach 10 million Mustangs sold.

Also in the <u>Times</u>, 50th Anniversary for Mach 1, Grande, Boss 429, and Boss 302. 1969 is coming next year. 1969 was a big year for the Mustang!

On a crisp October morning 5 club members and a coworker and her 4 year old daughter met in downtown







As soon as I receive the information from the Puyallup Downtown Association & the Sumner Main Street Association with staging directions, I'll get them out via email.


