

who joined PCMC at the Old Spaghetti Factory for "Let's Eat Out Fundraiser". PCMC had 43 people helping us earn \$117.55 plus \$15 donated by members who could not join us for dinner. PCMC will be donating the \$132.55 to PCMC Charities.. Thanks!



## **Charity Involvement (continued)**

Your gifts and support are a blessing to so many.

#### **EMERGENCY FOOD NETWORK \$1,500**

EFN partners with 64 emergency food programs in Pierce County and under their excellent fiscal management our gift of \$1500 will result in \$18,000 in nutritious food to meet their goal "that no person goes hungry".

PCMC volunteers giggled their way through frozen corn and fresh picked pears, and related jokes, repackaging a total 17,700 pounds into family sized packages for distribution.

#### ST. FRANCIS HOUSE \$1,500

Our gift will be placed in Sister Pat's discretionary fund to help with unforeseen emergency needs of a client. This donation can help prevent a family from being one step away from homelessness, going without electricity or missing a job interview because they need a bus pass.

Our 50/50 car show raffle benefited St. Francis in the amount of \$494.00. Plus many other attendees made significant private donations.

#### **CARING FOR KIDS \$700**

This all volunteer organization is helping kids in need in Lakewood, JBLM, Steilacoom and University Place. Their August Back to School fair helped over 2,000 prepare for the school year. In the month following, they responded to additional school supply orders, emergency food orders and requests at their clothing bank. In the Clover Park School District alone there are approximately 9,500 kids on free or reduced lunch according to statistics.

As part of our annual car show, PCMC members and guests donated 37 back packs filled with school supplies or made cash donations for a combined value of \$1,350.00.

#### SANTA'S CASTLE \$1,200

Since 1994 volunteers have provided holiday gifts to qualified families of all the armed forces and reserve units based at Joint Base Lewis-McChord. Each child receives 2 books, board game, 3 gifts, and coloring books/crayons. Babies receive a stuffed animal, toy and guilt. As often as possible kids also receive a bike.

This year's Christmas in July BBQ collected a combination of \$528 in toys and cash. Santa's Castle will also receive one half of the year-long 50/50 raffle which is finalized at the Christmas Party.

#### THE TEARS FOUNDATION \$700

The foundation seeks to compassionately lift the financial burden from Washington families who have experienced the death of a baby, by providing funds to assist with the cost of burial or cremation services. Tears also offers free ongoing emotional support in the form of support groups, online support, peer companions and bereavement resources.

Earlier this year a \$100 reward for club participation at the Tears Car Show was donated back to them. During the year, other awards and keep the change donations totaled \$338.80 and will be gifted.

#### KORUM FORD LINCOLN

PCMC members donated 324 lbs of peanut butter to the annual "Fill the Truck Bed Drive" to benefit the Puyallup Valley Food Bank.

#### **NOAH'S PET PROJECT**

A new charity was sponsored this year during a cruise and resulted in the collection of 270 pounds of food and additional cash.



## 1968 Candy Apple Red GT 390 Fastback



We've owned our car since 2000 and have been members of the Pierce County Mustang Club since then as well. I found it in my future father-in-law's shop under a bunch of empty boxes and an inch of dust. When I saw it was

an "S" code Mustang, I did some more research to find it was an original Candy Apple Red, 4-Speed

GT car. I had to have it! Even more ironic, the date it was sold off the new car lot was my birthday 3 years prior.

After driving it pretty much unrestored a few years, I took it off the road and restored it myself in 2005. I did all the body work and painting as well. The only things I didn't do were build the engine, put in the front and rear glass

and put the stripes on.

In 2006. I was contacted by Microsoft looking for a 1968 GT 390 Mustang Fastback to put in a video

game. After getting my car 3D modeled and taking it to a dyno in Redmond for sound recording, Project Gotham Racing 4 for the Xbox 360 was released in

2007 with my car as one of the many to choose from. The Project Gotham Racing series is about driving stock cars of all types. It was fun the first time driving it in the game. It was eerie as it sounded like I was sitting right in the car. You can probably get a copy of it for \$2 on the bargain shelf now. LOL!

The car is meant to be driven, so we like to take it out all the time. I enjoy taking her out to the Vintage Races every year. Eventually, I'd like to put a 5speed tranny in her and do a few things to make the

In the November **Mustang Times**:

Donald Farr, editor of the *Times*, wrote about the movement to electric cars at Ford and yes that includes our Mustangs. 2020 model year will include a hybrid (gas/electric) Mustang. At this point it looks like it might be an "EcoBoost turbo-four to offer V8 power with more torque." As a hybrid owner already (Ford Fusion) it will be interesting to hear this one when the gas kicks in. I have driven the EcoBoost as well and I liked it but it certainly didn't have the Vroom Vroom of our GT.

Keep listening for more from Team Edison which is Ford's electric vehicle group. It should be noted that there is a 2nd article in this issue by Darren Palmer, Team Edison Global Product Development Director (and GT350R owner) about the teams commitment of the members to a quality product that "works flawlessly" and that customers will love.

In the November/December issue of Journey Puget Sound (AAA magazine):
