

Mustang of the Month

George Ftikas

1975 Mustang II Blue 2+2 (Monroe Handler), 1975 Mustang II Silver Ghia



I bought the 2+2 in June of 1981 outside of Fort Campbell, Kentucky where I was stationed at the time. It's green with a light green interior. To pass

post inspection, I had to get a new exhaust and the cheapest route was going with side pipes. In April 1982, the car was sideswiped on the passenger side while I had stopped for a one car accident. I picked up the car from the Ford dealer body shop a couple of days before I was scheduled to leave Fort Campbell heading to Korea.

When I returned from Korea in 1984, I was stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas. The car went through a rolling restore / transformation while I was there. The car was painted a midnight blue with a silver hood scoop and tail panel.

In 1986, the car was parked in Indiana while I was heading off to Germany. After my assignment in Germany was done, I was stationed at Fort Lewis, Washington in 1989. In 1993, I drove the car from Fort Lewis to Fort Gordon, Georgia for a six month school. A couple of weeks after I returned to Fort Lewis in August 1993, I was stopped at a stop sign and was hit by a military Hummer (HMMWV). Jim Cassidy always tells folks it was run over by a tank.

I fought with Army claims for a few months before I had my insurance company deal with it. I bought a rotted out 1976 Cobra II to replace the parts I needed to include the dash unit as mine was broken in three pieces. I found a guy to get it put back together and paint the car. I had the Cobra II spoiler and side window louvers put on as well. I got it back in the spring of 1994.

We moved into our new home and one day in August 1994, I was washing the car and had the stereo on and heard that the Pierce County Mustang Club had gathered at Mallon Ford. So after I was done washing the car, I headed off to check things out. I joined the club and attended the PCMC show at the Lakewood Mall for my first show ever. I was in the club for several years.

In 2013, the car went through another major change. An original Dave Kent Monroe Handler body was purchased and installed on the car. The hood was drastically modified (all steel construction) and a roll cage, a new 302 motor and a new Ford 9 inch rear end was installed. The car was painted Kona Blue. It is still a work in progress, but it has come a very long way since then.

I joined back with the club at their show at Griot's Garage in 2017.

The Ghia was purchased in October 2006 as a Father/Son project while he was in High School. It has gone through a few changes since we got it. It is still used as a daily driver for now, but someday, it will get a major overhaul as well.


