The Board discussed: **Car Show**—Dash Plaque cost, **Annual Internal Audit**—Completed by Hank Deck, it was noted that Nancy did not need to present a Treasurer's Report to the Board every month, in the future Nancy will update the Board as needed. **Change of Cruise Meeting Spot**—We decided to leave it at the McDonalds but in the Park N Ride area – McDonalds is open early, has food and restrooms. **Peanut Butter Drive**—It has been a success, we have collected over our goal of 350. **Rainier's Game**—we still have a few more tickets to sell. **Getting Involved with the Youth**—We discussed ideas on how to involve youth in the car hobby – share tips on how to wash or change the oil in the cars, share our hobby with them by networking with the kids and teachers by being mentors, attending their car show and possibly sponsoring a trophy. Heidi reached out to the local schools to see how PCMC

can get more involved and for information on the High Schools car shows if they have one. **Monthly General Meeting Raffle**—PCMC's budget allows \$40 a month for the General Meeting Raffle. The sales tax is also include with the \$40. If we raise the budget, it would allow us to have a better quality of items for the raffle. The raffle is making money and can afford a budget increase. The General Meeting Raffle budget has been raised from \$40 to \$60 a month.

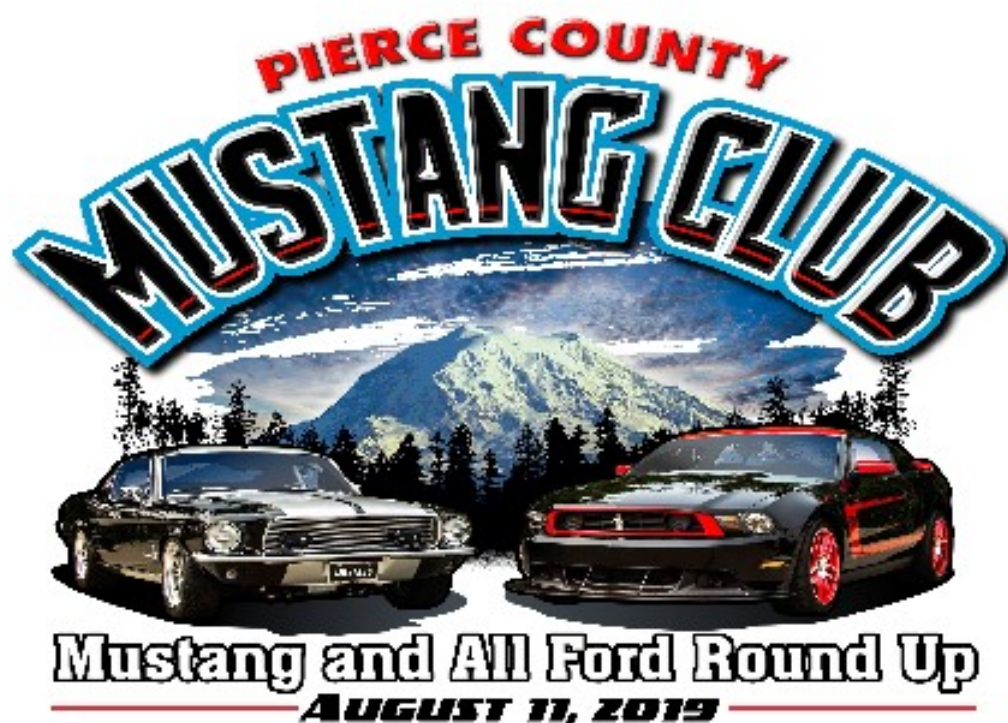

Trying to keep up with Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

According to the Ford Motor Company website, it looks like our favorite car is the best-selling sport coupe globally for the 4th year in a row. That doesn't surprise any of us, of course, and is probably why every time I go out I seem to see more on the road.

According to the same website, the Mustang EcoBoost is getting some upgrades with a "2.3-liter turbocharged inline-4 up to 330 hp." And a return of Grabber Lime.

We have been hearing about an electric/hybrid Mustang. On the Ford site it stated that they are working on a variety of electric cars one of which is "a Mustang-inspired crossover coming in 2020." Let us keep our eyes and ears open and see what transpires.

Besides electric, the goal is for the first Ford Autonomous car for 2021. Now the article didn't say Mustang but based on my 2018, it wouldn't take much for it to drive itself.

Change is always a challenge. I just keep reminding myself that when the car was first introduced people were so afraid of it that we needed a "Red Flag

Law." The law was that any car needed a person walking in front of it with a horn and a red flag. We adjusted and have managed without the "escort." I can only imagine the traffic issues if this law were in effect today.

Ironically, the car picked up "steam" so to speak as a way to reduce pollution. Today the 1-2 million lbs of manure and dead horses taken off streets in places like New York every day have been replaced by other issues.

It is a sign of the times that we are working on electric and hybrids at the same time we put out 700hp ponies. I am trying to picture my phone driving one of those!
