



Hi,
My name is Jim, and I have a Mustang problem.....

Seriously, when I was told that I was Mustang of the Month, I thought "Really? Me?" I wonder what Mustang? Could it be the 95 Cobra I bought at Korum Ford in 1996 that came with a free membership to the Pierce County Mustang club? Could it be Joe Dirt? Could it be the Cobra that I was driving when Jerry Murphy said I was in the FOOSH Club, because that's the sound we made when I passed him? No, it couldn't be any of those..... It must be the Roush!

So, the story of the Roush! In 2008, I was at Five Star Ford, visiting with my friend Mike, who said I just had to be there when his brand new Black Jack showed up! When the truck showed up, there were three Roush cars on it: Mikes Black Jack, a Vista Blue 427R, and a Vapor 427R Trak Pak.

I was fascinated by the Trak Pak! It was a serious road race set up with the supercharged Stage 3 engine! The guys made it worse by letting me back it off the trailer, and drive it into the service bay for new car prep. I was hooked! But, it wasn't to be. I had recently bought a new truck, and just couldn't make it happen.

Then, almost a year later, I was at Five Star again with a bunch of friends to do a fund raiser. My friend Karena saw the car, and she not only fell in love with it, but she bought it! I was jealous.....lol

She used it for everything! Showing houses, going to car shows, errands, everything! She even put a baby seat in it! Trying to keep up with the Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

From the *Mustang Times*, November 2019:

Check out the article by our own Charlene Rivera about the Fox-Body Picnic. Congratulations for getting into the times...but how did you manage to do it and have no pictures of yourself in the article....

There is a new world record for the larget Mustang Parade.. Congratulations to Ford who gathered 1,326 Mustangs from all over Europe on the Lommel Proving Ground in Belgium. There was an "uninterrupted convoy with no more than 20 metres between each car." Mustang 's world wide popularity it just continuing to grow. According tot the article, "Mustang was the world's best-selling sports coupe for the fourth year in a row in 2019" and in the first 1/2 of 2019 there were "5,500sales in Europe, a 3.7 present increase compared with the same period last year." None of that should surprise us, we love our Mustangs and it just seems natural that everyone else should as well.

Did you hear: Fords Electric Mustang Project Car—Mustang Lithium EV. It is reported to have 900hp, a manual transmission, and 1,000 footpounds of torque. Don't rush out yet, it isn't for sale yet. It was reported from Ford by CNN. My question—Will it come with a soundtrack?

November saw the Mustang inspired electric SUV out for view. **Not only inspired!** It is the Mustang Mach E, a 4 door crossover vehicle. Well, what do we all think!

Also seen out there in Facebook land, a 14 year old girl has invented a system for removing the

blind spots from the drivers seat. She used a webcam, projector, and 3-D printed materials to "fill the space the car frame blocks for drivers." This young lady enter this in the Broadcast MASTERS (Math, Applied Science, Technology, and Engineering for Rising Stars) competition for middle schoolers. She won the top prize "\$25,000 Samueli Foundation Prize in honor of overall STEM excellence," according to Sasha Lekach on Mashable. WOW! I could have used this a couple of times recently.

I was late picking this up, but the **Seattle Magazine**, October 2019, had a section on "Fall Road Trips." 


