


- 1. Headlights On—lets others know what is happening, easier for us to see if members are together
- 2. Don't Follow Too Close—safety
- 3. Allow Other Traffic to Intermingle—want to be seen as a friendly, cool event coming not a congestion problem
- 4. Lead Car Should Keep Speed Reasonable—to catch up if caught at a light it requires at least 10mph faster than group to catch up which is a problem if the group is going over the limit
- 5. Walkie Talkie Protocol (we just use cell phones as needed) be safe and let people know when there is an issue further back
- 6. Lend a Hand—no one wants to be left behind, if someone is having issues please let the leader know and stop and help out
- 7. Have Your Car in Order—fill it up and make sure it is running properly so you have less chance of needing to be rescued

From the *Mustang Times*, January 2020:

Wow, lots in the <u>Times</u> last month. Of course all over the issue are the new electric Mustangs. There is the Mach-E joining "the Mustang stable as an all-electric, four-door SUV." I know there are differing opinions as to whether this is good or not. Regardless of where you stand on the issue, this vehicle will have 255 to 332 hp. The GT will have 459 hp, 612 lb ft of torque and will be all-wheel-drive. It will be out in 2021 and it is rumored that it will come with a sound track.

As the article reminded us, Carroll Shelby said in 1965, "' If it's a good car; the name won't matter. And if it's a bad car; the name won't save it.'

Besides the Mach-E another car was unveiled at SEMA, "900-horsepower Mustang Lithium with six-speed transmission." This is also, as the name should tell you, all-electric and I believe it will be out in 2022 along with the all-electric F-150. I am going to have to work on my **GRRRing** sound.
