



The Food Bank is now operating each Wednesday and Friday from the Education wing. Clients wait in their cars and are called in by number. Families get a commodity bag - canned and dried foods, cereal, plus a meat item, butter, and eggs, breads when available. Some personal items are also available. Starting this week we are giving fresh vegetables - potatoes, carrots and onions. We are thankful for all the wonderful donations - our storage areas are full! We continue to get weekly deliveries from EFN (Emergency) Food Network). Monetary donations total near \$35,000!

Rebuilding of the Food Bank building is in progress. Cleanup of the burned area has been completed FREE by Service. Crescent Reality has offered to rebuild for FREE! Once started, the building will be finished in less than two months. Smokey, our director, asked that if be completed by the end of the school year. We will continue opening Wed, and Fri, until the new building is open. We thank the church for giving us the space and storage to continue operation and valunteers to help
