The President's Choice - hopefully Rainier Audio will sponsor that one, Missy will contact them to ask if they will. CJ's will sponsor the Founder's Choice. We will wait on ordering trophies and the tanks & V-neck's until June when some of the businesses are back up and running. Some of the dash plaques have already been started but Nancy was able to talk to Big John's and have her hold off on finishing them.

New Business

Meeting Locations - Heidi - Susan from Korum Ford contacted Heidi a few weeks ago about PCMC no longer holding their meetings at Korum Ford. PCMC needs to find a new place to hold board meetings and general meetings. The Board had discussed this by email earlier and a list was made of places where PCMC could possibly move to. Please see sheet for complete details. The Puyallup library was good but the problem is you can only book for three months and no guarantee of being able to have a consistent four month. The Puyallup Activity Center charges - we would need to figure out if we could fit in one room or two rooms and the cost. Nancy 's church - it would work but we would need to change our meeting day from Monday or Wednesday due to the church already having an activity on Tuesday nights. Lakewood Ford would be too small to hold a general meeting but

could hold our board meetings. Denny's at South Hill would work but then it's too close to the Friday Night Dinner Out and would we meet the minimum requirement of \$100 purchased a food and beverage. Johnny's at Fife is closed until the quarantine has been lifted from the virus and we

If you don't get the magazine, go on line and check out Mustang Club of America. Always interesting information and great photos.

In other news, April is the month for National Mustang Day. I am sure most know the story but since we can't go cruise around together to celebrate I thought I'd retell the story here in honor of the day and in case a few don't know it.

Here it is as described by Donald Farr (editor of the **Mustang Times**) in his book, **Mustang Fifty Years Celebrating America's Only True Pony Car**:

On April 16th, 1964, "Ford purchased simultaneous commercial slots for all prime-time TV programming between 9:30 and 10 pm." For those youngsters out there, in 1964 there were 3 main stations and a few others but not the hundreds that we have today. The shows that would have been on were *Hazel*, *Perry Mason* and the *Jimmy Dean Show*. A sitcom, detective show and a variety show (not about sausage).

On the 17th, "2,600 major newspapers carried full page Mustang advertisements; 24 national magazines were on the newsstands with full-page or double-truck ads (I had to look this up—spread over 2 pages) featuring what Iacocca called the Mona Lisa look—a profile of a white hardtop along with the Mustang's '\$2,368 F.O.B' price and the simple statement, 'The Unexpected.'" Again for you youngsters, newspapers were where people read the news everyday. They were paper and folded out and had crossword puzzles and you read it with your morning coffee. (Ok, maybe you knew about those.)

You can't forget about the Mustang that was completely taken apart, sent up an elevator to the top of the Empire State Building, and then reassembled all for a photo. And you think I'm bad making you gather around for a group shot.

All that should have gotten people's attention, right. Ford also displayed Mustangs in "200 Holiday Inn lobbies and in 15 of the country's busiest airports."

There was more but I think you get the idea. If you want something to do as we prepare (hopefully) to come out of isolation, look up Captain Stanley Tucker (bought Mustang VIN100001 by accident) and Gail Wise (bought the first Mustang ever sold—2 days before they were advertised). By the way, last I heard, she still had it.

Well, I hope that catches everyone up. Thank you Donald for writing the book and to Ford including Lee Iacocca and all the team for building the Mustang!

If you have something you have seen that you think others might be interested in, send it my way.

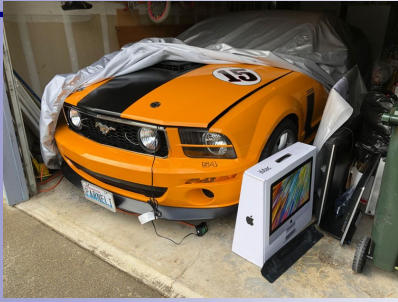
Past Events: National Mustang Day April 17, 2020
