Treasurer's Report - Nancy Freeman:

Nancy had to have some maintenance on the club printer. Under normal conditions Nancy would be able to receive two signatures from the Chair positions. The Board agreed to allow Nancy to sign the check made out to her for the printer maintenance to cover her cost.

New Business

Meeting Locations - Heidi - PCMC needs to find a new place to hold board meetings and general meetings. The Puyallup library is booked for July -Heidi will double check with the Library to make sure. The Puyallup Activity Center – we have not heard from. Nancy 's church - it would work but we would need to change our meeting day to Monday or Wednesday due to the church already having an activity on Tuesday nights, but due to the Stay at Home Order the event using the Church on Tuesday might cancel. Disinfecting Your Car

I came across this article in the America's Car Museum Volunteer Newsletter that I thought would be helpful. Marissa Merkel, ACM Volunteer Coordinator, gave us permission to use her article from Hagerty, "How to disinfect your car without destroying its interior by Grace Houghton, March 24, 2020.

She begins by defining cleaning (removes dirt and germs but doesn't kill them) and sanitizing and disinfecting (may not remove all dirt but have varying degrees of germ killing properties). For the purposes of our cars, it is best to clean and then sanitize, according to the article and Haggerty.

Here are the main tips she presents:

- High Traffic Areas 1st—CDC recommends starting with steering wheel, interior door handles, cup holders, gear shifter, seat belt buckles, and radio/ climate control. With that done, you can move to the rest.
- 2. Choose the correct wipe or cleaner—If it is EPA registered (there will be a number on the back label), it has "certified cleaning power and will le-

gitimately kill germs." Be careful of terms like cleaner, disinfectant, sanitizer that are just used to sell products. (like putting "cholesterol free on items that never had cholesterol in the first place.)

- 3. Use correct product on the right material.
- 4. Make sure the product sits on the surface long enough to kill the germs.
- 5. Conduct a test patch on something inconspicuous. I am not always good with this step but it could save some money, swearing, and time in the end.
- 6. Preserve your work—Wash hands before entering, keep hand sanitizer in car, change and wear gloves and dispose of them after each drive.
- 7. Avoid direct contact with gas pumps.

I hope this is useful!

PS—Don't forget to wipe the keys



2000 Bright Atlantic Blue GT Convertibles and 1968 Acapulco Blue GT/CS California Special

I currently own two Mustangs:

2000 Bright Atlantic Blue GT Convertible which I purchased in late December 1999 from Korum as my Christmas present. I was visiting friends in Port Orchard when I came up with the license plate name: MYY2KGT. I have attended a few car shows with it especially when it was new, even a MCA Na-



tional show in Durham, NC where it was not judged since new Mustangs were voted on not judged. It was also the last trip back

east with my companion at the time Rusty as he passed late 2000. The 2000 was also used to chauffer the Daffodil Princesses through some of the local towns other then the Daffodil Parade.



My second Mustang is a 1968 Acapulco Blue GT/CS California Special with a 302 4bbl engine and C-4 Automatic transmission which I purchased new from Hayward Ford, Hayward California in early-mid 1968. It came with 3.00 rear end, but I changed it in the 1980s to 2.75 for better mileage due to the trips I made. I also installed upper and lower consoles which it did not have at the time of purchase. Also when I purchased it, I purchased and had a Hood Tach installed as I thought the ones on the Firebirds were cool. This one item makes it easy to recognize and it made it easier to maintain my speed instead of taking my eyes off the road to glance at the speedometer. It has been driven in all 48 continental United States and four Canadian Provinces. It has been to shows in about a third of the 48 states and 3 of the 4 Canadian Provinces. Due to all the traveling I have done, the mileage is a bit over 515,000. During

these trips since mid 80s my traveling companion was Rusty until he passed away; then my next companion was Tanner.

As a side note, I have owned two other Mustangs, one a 1965 Honey Gold Mustang which I used as a trade-in to purchase the Cal Spec; and a 1993 White LX which I used as a trade in when I purchased the 2000 GT.

Trying to keep up with the Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

Gale Halderman

As we know, Gale Halderman past away in April. Pick up any Mustang book and you will find information about Mr. Halderman as one of the original designers of the Ford Mustang. According to Mustang Genesis The creation of the Pony **Car** by Robert A Fria Gale Halderman was hired in 1955 as a designer in the Lincoln-Mercury Studio. He worked on the styling for the 1960 Falcon, the 1961 Thunderbird and eventually the Ford Mustang. The book states that he drew up "5 styling sketches, Joe Oros liked one of them and the rest is history as they say. He helped move the car from a clay model to the production line to many of the design changes that happened through the years until he retired in 1994.

Thank you Gale for all of your ideas and hard work to make out dream cars possible.

Check out this link, <u>(https://www.autoweek.com/</u> car-life/classic-cars/a32266716/history-of-the-<u>mustang-logo/</u>) sent by David Cushion that describes the history of the Mustang Logo. It describes how it was almost the Allegro, Avanti, Torino, or Cougar. Now allegro means "at a rapid pace" so that would certainly describe our ponies. Avanti means "forward" so that could be moving forward, forward thinking, or front-end forward which might also work. But you know, Studebaker took that. Torino is an Italian capital and Cougar is a whole other animal all together. Quite frankly, I am glad they settled on "Mustang."

The article describes the changes over the years, the tribars (all American pony) and the pony in the corral. They considered a horse head for a while...again, they made a good choice in my book. But as we know, lacocca, from the beginning, put the pony facing right. According to the article he said, "the Mustang is a wild horse, not a domesticated racer." (ponies go around a race track to the left)

From my own research over the last month or so, ladies, here are a few fun facts for you:

- Bertha Benz—first auto marketing dept (1888)
- Margaret Wilcox—invented the car heater (1893)
- Camille du Gast—1st female star of motorsports in her 20hp Panhard
- Mary Anderson—1st patent for manual windshield wipers (1903)
- Dorothy Levitt—believed to have pioneered rear view mirror (1905), first ones you had to hold up by hand
- Florence Lawrence (silent films) and her mother Charlotte Bridgwood (aka Lotta Lawrence from vaudeville) - patents for brake lights/rear turn signals and mechanical window wipers respectively (1913/1917)
- Alice Huyler Ramsey—1st woman to drive across the US in her Maxwell DA (1909)
- Wilma Russey—1st New York taxi driver in her long leather gloves and leopard stole and hat (1915)

My father grew up in the late 50's ~ early 60's. This was the start of the modern car culture. As I grew up, I would listen to his stories of the cars he had and how he would modify them to go faster or look better. His favorite was his 56 Merc with a flathead V8 and shaved door handles, Persimmon and White. I heard stories of street races and cruising. When I was about 10 he bought a 1969 Ford Bronco.
