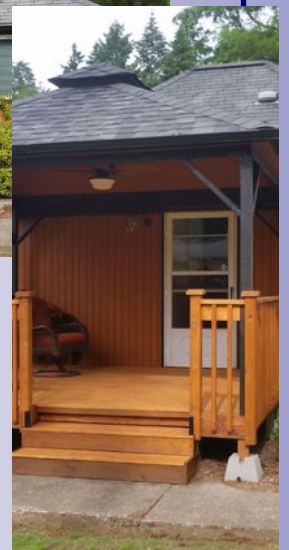

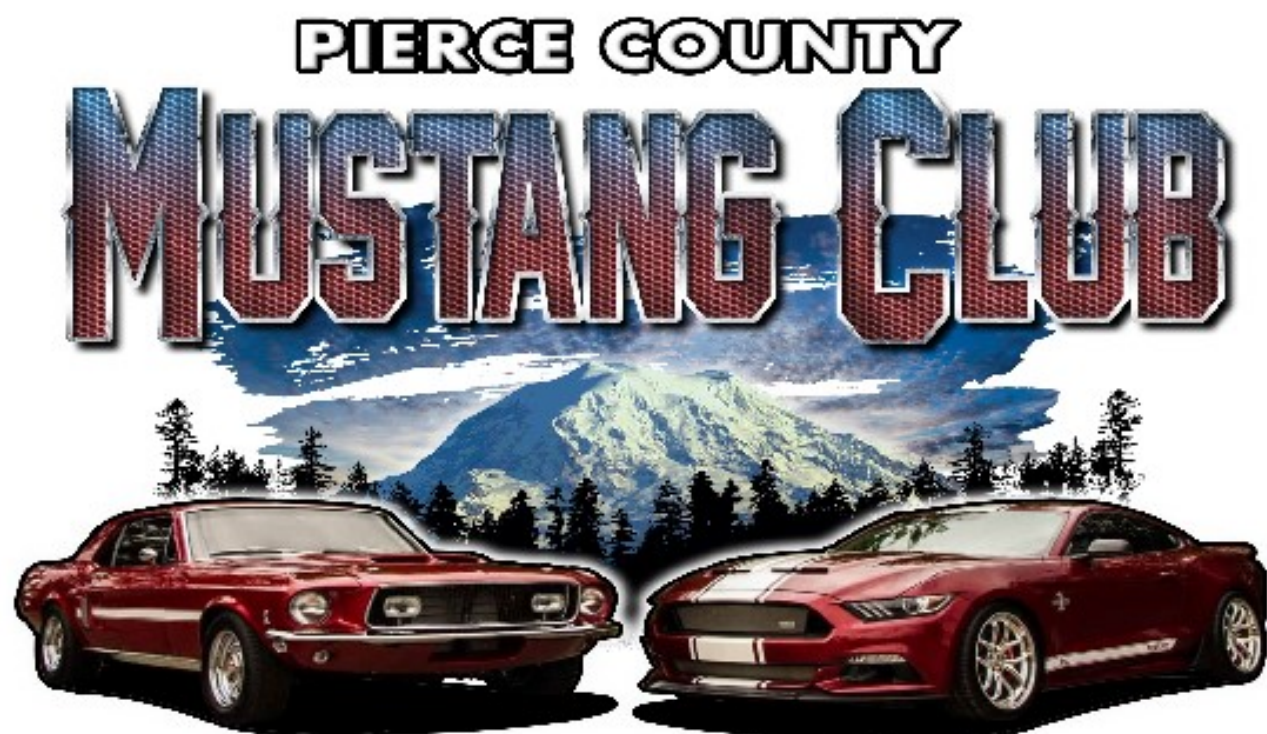

In the News

Trying to keep up with the Mustang news? Here are a few items to check out.

From our Club Insurance Carrier Heacock Insurance: (by permission)

Collector Car Insurance: Am I Covered?

"Does my car qualify for collector car insurance?" is a question we hear every day at Heacock Classic, and more times than not, the answer is a resounding YES! But the conversation rarely ends there. Heacock Classic is one of the nation's top providers of classic car and collector car insurance. It's our pleasure to help you better understand the ins and outs behind insurance for collector cars.

It's this time of year automotive enthusiast's dust off their steeds or prepare the finishing touches on the winter project. Just before setting forth on our shakedown runs, they call an insurance agent to ensure that their car is covered. The key word here: "covered". There's a big difference between a policy that provides "legal to drive on the street" coverage and "properly covered collector car that gives you peace of mind" coverage. Without further ado, let's dig in.

What Qualifies?

The initial question we hear at Heacock Classic is: "How old does my collector car have to be to qualify for your insurance program?". For many, when they think of a collector car, they think of the old maxim that a car needs to be 25 years old to qualify as Collector Car. As a matter of fact, Heacock Classic does not have year of manufacture restrictions in our insurance program. We can insure your brand-new Mustang, Corvette, Shelby, etc., if it lives the "collector car lifestyle".

What is the collector car lifestyle? Great question! To determine this, ask yourself:

- Does your prized possession live in a garage when it's not in use?
- Do you use it for fun drives and not as a daily driver or backup transportation when your daily driver is in for service?
- Do you find that when you drive your Mustang, you're usually out enjoying it on a pleasure drive with a couple of like-minded enthusiasts to a unique destination or event?

If the answer to each these questions is "yes", then it is like-

ly that your car will qualify for our collector car insurance! Simply put, collector car insurance is for those cars that are well taken care of, driven infrequently, and for pleasure use.

Who Qualifies?

The next qualification to address is the age of driver(s) and driving record. In most collector car programs, there will be a minimum driver age, as well as a good driving record requirement. Insurers will want to verify that the drivers of these vehicles have a good amount of driving experience and have demonstrated the ability to be a good citizen when behind the wheel.

Note: If you have multiple speeding tickets and/or accidents, you may not qualify. This is special insurance for specialty cars, restrictions apply.

Are all auto policies the same?

Well now that we've set the ground rules, let's talk about what you can expect from your collector car policy in terms of coverage and expected premium savings. As with your daily auto policy you're going to find that collector car policies are similar in that they provide coverage for liability to others in the form of *Bodily Injury*, and *Property Damage*. They can also provide coverage for *Uninsured Motorists Bodily Injury*, in the event you are involved in an accident with someone who doesn't carry insurance. Where you will find the biggest difference between your daily auto policy and a collector vehicle policy is how the vehicle itself is covered for *Physical Damage*. Physical Damage to the collector car is also known as *Comprehensive and Collision Coverage*. These are the perils that would be known to cause damage to the vehicle: theft, fire, flood, collision with another vehicle or object, etc. This is where the collector car policy begins to show its main advantage over the daily auto policy.

Damage to your car: Agreed Value vs. Stated Amount

Time for rubber to hit the road (so to speak). You've likely heard the terms Stated Amount and Agreed Value thrown around by insurance agents and car guys alike. What's the difference and which one is for you and your collector vehicle(s)?

When talking about Stated Amount, this is when you 'state' the value of your car to your insurance company, and they begin charging you premium based upon that value(ACV) basis to determine the payout for the vehicle.

If the car is involved in a loss that deems it a total loss, the insurance company will then pay the lesser of a.) the cost to repair or replace the vehicle or b.) the Actual Cash Value (ACV) basis to determine the payout for the vehicle. ACV allows the carrier to consider age, mileage, and condition to establish the value of the car. So even though you've been paying insurance for what you thought was \$50,000 coverage on your collector car, you could receive a check for its total loss that is substantially lower than that amount when age and mileage are factored in.

In turn, Agreed Value is established when the insured and insurance company agree on the value of the car at the time of the policy inception. The premium is determined based on that amount and if the vehicle is involved in a covered total loss, the value of the car is already agreed upon. No depreciation, no arguments over condition or options and upgrades. Agreed Value is the amount you are paid, for your total loss, less any applicable deductible. It is a superior coverage when it comes to the physical damage to your car. In short, if Agreed Value coverage is available for your collector vehicle(s), this is what you want.

Peace of Mind and Savings

A good collector car policy will do several things for you that your daily auto policy likely will not. First, did you know that the average savings you can expect on your classic/collector car is up to 40% over the cost of a daily auto policy? Factors such as infrequent use, secure storage, and clean driving records add up! Second, better coverage in the event of a total loss. Agreed Value policies save you the time and headache of arguing with the claims adjuster about the value of your collector car. Other coverages you'll find on a collector car policy include:

- Roadside Assistance
- Spare Parts Coverage
- Trip Interruption
- Choice of repair shop

July Challenge

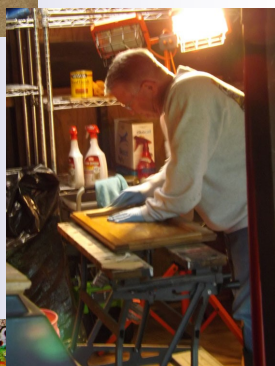
In our current environment, this month's challenge was to send in a photo of what positive things you are doing to stay healthy and sane. Here are some of the examples of what people have been doing:
