Here is some information about our 1967 Mustang:

We purchased this Mustang about three and a half years ago in Illinois. We have undone all the incorrect changes that had been made to the car.

- Replaced the manual transmission with the c-4 automatic
- Repainted the engine and the engine compartment to the original colors
- Polished and re-chromed all the stainless to new condition and put all the chrome under the hood that was possible
- Replaced the convertible top
- Replaced the top actuators
- Installed all new door and window handles
- Installed air conditioning, struts and shocks, power steering and brakes, and tilt steering wheel

We can say our Mustang sports every factory and dealer option available in 1967 except the original cruise control.

We re-painted it to the original "Candy Apple Red" and updated with new Mustang wheels and new white side wall tires.

So many hours of work and caring went into this project.

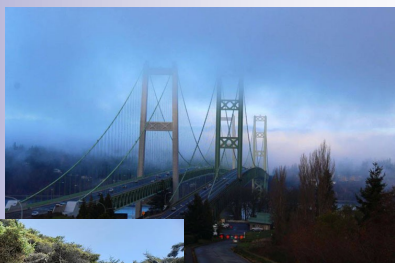

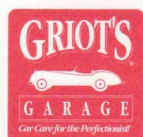
