

Mustang of the Month

Steve & Laurie Howe 1967 Yellow Coupe 2005 Red Coupe

When I was in high school, a good friend had a red '67 Mustang coupe. I thought it was the coolest car and wanted one badly. However, my Dad thought a '66 Dart with a straight 6 was a better first car, so I drove that through high school. Once I graduated, I started my search for a '67 Mustang. I bought my first one without my Dad's help (cause I knew most everything by then) and it turned out to be a fake GT with mucho bondo repair and blew more blue smoke the more I drove it.

About a year later (1978) a friend of my parents decided to sell the wife's '67



coupe. I can't find any of my original paperwork of the sale so I'm not sure how many miles it had when I bought it. The couple I bought it from were the second owners. The first owner was a car rental agency here in Tacoma. I have two rental agreements from 1967 that came with the car's documentation. The couple had purchased it in Feb 1968 and I purchased it in April 1978. I drove it a LOT in the early years. Then I decided I should restore it so I wanted to start with the engine. I bought a long block and my father-in-law helped me replace the engine. After replacing a couple leaky heater cores over the years, I discovered that the floor pans were rusting through, so I had all four pans replaced. Then life happened and nothing much was done for years. It was in storage for a long time and when I took it out and tried to start it, it broke a rod so another block was put in by our mechanic. A

few years later we had engine issues and a new mechanic found metal shavings in the oil pump screen, so a 3rd block was installed. It gets started a little more

often now but is mostly in storage waiting to find someone who can help us restore the sheet metal.



In 2005, the S197

generation came out and I was in love again. Loved the retro styling which reminded me so much of my older '67. We talked and talked about it (almost too long) and finally decided we would buy one in July of 2005 but new ones were really hard to find by then. Fugate Ford had just bought one from a dealer in Colorado, so we went to check it out. I drove it and the car was probably sold before we got two miles down the road. This one isn't driven as much as the '67 when I bought that. It currently has just 33K miles. In 2006, we took a trip to Montana and hit a deer on our way home. So sad! Luckily, the car was so new otherwise insurance would have totaled it. We don't drive it on the highway at night anymore if we can help it.

We originally belonged to Mustangs Northwest, but they met in North Seattle and we couldn't attend most events because Laurie worked on Saturdays. So we only lasted a few years before dropping out. Sometime later we read about PCMC hosting a car show at the South Hill Mall. We checked it out and thought we'd like to join this club. However, it took a few years before we finally attended a meeting and joined. We've really enjoyed our time and the many activities with the club.


