# SENDING BEST WISHES TO OUR CHARITIES

Under the always amazing leadership of car show chair Charlene Rivera the 2020 show was ready to go---the tees underwritten by Korum were ready for purchase, all classes and specialty awards were sponsored, dash plaques picked up, the to do list nearly completed.

#### AND THEN COVID-19 AND CANCELLATION

Now what to do? Charlene reached out to all our sponsors giving them the option of requesting their donation be returned, give to charity or roll over to the 2021 show. The outstanding response was ROLL IT OVER! Korum Automotive Group said to use the balance of their sponsorship for 2020 charity giving AND they look forward to providing another sponsorship in 2021! PCMC is incredibility lucky to have such wonderful support from all our sponsors.

Lacking the anticipated funds from the car show raffle, 50/50 and back pack/supplies, our charitable donations won't be as robust as in years past years, but PCMC is still fortunate to donate to the following.

Santa's Castle has provided Christmas since 1994 to the children of qualified families of all the armed forces and reserve units at Joint Base Lewis McChord. Our \$400 donation will assist them as they continue to provide gifts and smiles.

EMERGENCY FOOD NETWORK partners with 82 emergency food programs in Pierce County and under their excellent fiscal management our gift of \$500 will result in a \$6,000 value toward food purchases for fami-

lies in need. PCMC volunteers were able to gather in October to repackage 2,100 pounds of frozen French cut green beans.

St. Francis House, located in Puyallup has been providing support to individuals and families across East Pierce County since 1974. Their FREE clothing bank, furniture bank, evening meal program emergency assistance, ELL Program and Back to School Program offer hope and ease hardships of those in need. Sister Pat will place our \$500 gift in her discretionary fund to help with unforeseen emergency needs of a client.

Caring for Kids this all volunteer organization is helping kids in Lakewood, Clover Park, Steilacoom and University Place school systems providing support all year long to hundreds of families in need. Our donation of \$500 will be a small but welcome addition in support of their program.

Other support during 2020. The club collected caps, gloves, scarves, socks and cash from our January cruise for St. Francis House. Our refund for the purchase of Daffodil Parade flowers was donated back to the Festival. Before the virus shut us down we collected 312 pounds of peanut butter enough for 4,992 sandwiches. Lastly, PCMC volunteers able to gather in October to repackage 2,100 pounds of frozen French cut green beans for distribution by Emergency Food Network.

COVID-19 may have slowed us down in 2020, but PCMC members continued to be a blessing in our communities. Looking forward to seeing your smiles in 2021.

Charity Recommendations - discussion/vote - Nancy

The board is recommending our charitable donation be as follows:

EFN, Caring for Kids, St. Francis House donation of \$750 each PLUS Santa's Castle donations \$400 (made throughout the year) motion-Jerry Murphy, 2<sup>nd</sup>-Clay Concannon.

<u>Discussion</u> – **Paul Geise**: should we just hold on to our \$\$ until we know what the money will look like for next year?? First 3 months expenditures will be \$3,200: GL insurance, shed rental, shed insurance, club activities. There might not be as much money for monthly activities. If we pay the entire year for the shed, we get a month for free. **Lori Howe**: questioned if we could distribute the charitable donations throughout the 2020 & 2021 instead of give all at once. Originally Korum wanted to roll over their entire sponsorship (exclusive of tee shirt underwriting).

Heidi Geise: contacted Susan Fleury at Korum and asked if instead the \$1500 could be used for 2020 charity.

Their team agreed and is giving us \$1,000 toward 2021 show.

Hank Deck: We need to stop cutting ourselves short and have to cut back on what we are doing. We want to have our members come back, we don't want to cut our activities.

Option A-\$750 x 3 EFN, Caring for Kids, St. Francis House

Option B-\$500 each now plus Santa's Castle \$400 then in March and look again at our funding and contribute another \$250 to our 3 charities if possible.

(motion-Greg 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve Option B, 2nd Chuck, approved)

### 2007 Blue/White Shelby GT500

I remember it clearly, as if it happened yesterday. It was early 2007. I think around March. I had bought some magazines to read on the airplane as we were going on vacation. I grew up with brothers that loved their muscle cars and since then, I have always had a passion for the Ford Mustangs. So all three magazines were Mustang



magazines. That is where I first heard about the reproduction of the Shelby GT500. Honestly, I really didn't know much at the time about

the early Shelby GT500's.

The articles I read were about an amazing newly designed model of the Shelby GT500. Why pay much attention to an article about a car that seemed completely out of reach for me. I never ever would have dreamed that I would or could own one. 500HP, limited and numbered car, retro to look and feel like the old GT500's, and a big price tag. They were being produced at a very limited rate so they were very sought after cars. The Ford dealers at the time were only allocated 2-3 a year. If you could find one for sale, it most likely had a price tag of 10k-30k over MSRP and you had to wait in line. So add up all the hurdles there, (high priced, limited number and allocations, wait lines, etc.), it felt like roadblocks and not hurdles.

I can't actually remember how I found out that the Ford dealer near me had an allocation for the 2007 Shelby GT500 and a pending sale that fell through but I felt like one of the hurdles of the roadblock was knocked down. Ok, they have one for sale.... Next hurdle, how much? What was the sticker shock? This part could very easily be a deal-breaker so I still was not getting my hopes up. Here we go again with thoughts of, this car seems so far out of reach, I'll never be lucky enough to own one. Well, I guess I was able to get over this hurdle too. Only 10K above MSRP! What?????? That was doable! I believe I did the sales paperwork for it right then and there. Now I had to wait! Ugh. It wasn't due to be delivered to the dealer until May!

Mother's Day, May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2007 I went down to the Ford dealer and took possession of my brand new 2007 Shelby GT500!!!! Blue with White stripes. It was mine! All mine! And it still is..... 13 years later. It's my garage princess show car. Every time I get in it and drive it, it still feels brand new to me.


