From Paul Geise: The Band—Part I

Howdy! I've been told I can write something for the newsletter. Something informative, unique (not pertaining to cars) and or, funny. I'll give it my best shot. If this doesn't work...well... I won't say who suggested me (I respect their privacy) but, he owns a really cool Grabber Orange Parnelli Jones Mustang. Hope I didn't give it away.

As many of you know I used to be in a rock & roll band. We travelled all over the western U.S., into Canada, & got as far east as Nebraska or Iowa. I don't ac-

tually remember as it was the 70's & well... it was the 70's...

I played bass, some keyboards, sang (mostly harmony, if the singer blew out his voice, or if the club was on fire & they needed to get people out quickly!) but mostly played bass. I am definitely NOT a virtuoso, I was considered "adequate" which is why I don't play for people today. I own about 10 or so (I say "or

May he rest in peace) James Jamerson (Motown, Funk Brothers, plucked w/ only 1 finger, he called it "The Hook"...rest in peace), Chris Squire (Yes. Loved his tone! Could never quite duplicate it, but WOW!...rest in peace) & Leland Sklar, (a "session" player for James Taylor, Carole King, & was the replacement for Toto's bass player when he passed away. If you've ever seen "Chewy" from "Star Wars"... uhhh ...you've seen Leland. So, I will write of my experiences as I remember them the best I can. When Heidi & I started showing our '07 GT I thought we needed a little something for display. So, I bought a Fender Mustang bass (short scale of course!) Stripped it down, painted it "Vista Blue" to match the car, added a black & white checkered custom (makes it go faster) pick guard, a checkered strap (increases the "COOL" factor) & a Bartolini "hot rod" pick-up. I really didn't need to add the bit about the pick-up... but I just like to say "BARTOLINI"!

InstaPot Adventures with Missy

Well, a new year a new me? Not exactly. Some of you might be aware that I have taken on some new responsibilities this year. My favorite student, Miguel, moved on to high school. I have committed to working with him through graduation. So, I am up in Kent at least twice a week working with him on his class/homework. I usually get some wonderful Mexican food for dinner. Both his parents are fantastic cooks. I get home anywhere from 6-9:30 pm and still make dinner for Dad. That was making for a very long day. I have been interested in those InstaPots and did some investigating. Found one I liked and bought one on Amazon. I ended up getting the Instant Pot Ultra 10-in-1 Electric Pressure Cooker, Slow Cooker, Rice Cooker, Steamer, Sauté, Yogurt Maker, Cake Maker, Egg Cooker, Sterilizer, and Warmer, 8 Quart, 16 One-Touch Programs model. What a title right?

Next step? Pinterest of course. The first attempt would be Pasta Fagioli Soup just like you get at Olive Garden, I hope. https://www.pinterest.com/
pin/225672631317352449/ if you are on Pinterest or https://www.lecremedelacrumb.com/instant-pot-pasta-e-fagioli-soup/ if you are not. It looked easy. The hardest thing was the chopping and the soaking of the beans. It said:

Prep Time: 10 Minutes Cook Time: 20 Minutes Soaking Time: 6 hours Total Time: 30 Minutes Servings: 4 people

Ingredients

2/3 cup dried white great northern or navy beans

2/3 cup dried red kidney beans

1 lb ground Italian sausage (mild or spicy)

½ yellow onion, diced

3 tsp minced garlic

4 cups chicken broth

1-15 oz can tomato sauce

1-15 oz can diced tomatoes (not drained)

2 celery ribs, chopped

½ cup carrots, chopped/sliced/julienned

1 cup ditalini pasta, boiled till tender

1 tsp salt or to taste

1 ½ tsp dried Italian blend seasoning

1/4 tsp crushed red pepper flakes (optional)

fresh basil, cracked pepper, grated parmesan cheese (for topping)

Instructions:

I soaked the beans overnight, cause I'm impatient, and I chopped the onion, celery and julienned the carrots.

I combined all beans in a LARGE pot, covered with H₂O (Miguel is taking Biology and we are studying chemical make ups, so it is H₂O not water), and brought to a boil, then reduced to simmer for 1 hour stirring occasionally until tender and cooked through. Then drained the beans. Why a LARGE pot? I doubled the recipe. Be careful, it almost didn't fit in my pot. Lol

Preheat on Sauté, then add sausage, onions and sauté for 3-5 until meat is browned. Add garlic and cook 1-2 minutes longer until fragrant.

Switch instapot to "soup" add broth, tomato sauce, diced tomatoes, veggies, salt/pepper, red pepper flakes, beans and Italian seasoning then stir to combine.

Lock the lid. Cook on high for 10 minutes. Allow pot to sit for 3-4 minutes and then turn the release valve for a "quick" release.

Stir in (cooked) Ditalini pasta, garnish with cracked black pepper, fresh basil, and grated parmesan cheese if desired and serve.

I followed the instructions, all pretty easy. Total cooking time was only 30 minutes. Just don't forget to cook the pasta. I did. I looked at the end result and I knew something was missing. You can't really have Pasta Fagioli soup without the pasta!

Take Aways:

Dad LOVED this soup.

Paco (Miguel's dad) LOVED this soup.

If you like your soup to have more liquid, add almost twice the broth.

Dad likes more onions, so I added more.

Dad likes his veggies, so I was very generous with my measuring.

Unless you are cooking for an army or a 14-yearold boy, don't double the recipe. It barely fit in our 8 quart pot. And I have had to buy larger Tupperware to fit our new leftovers.

If you do double the recipe, all the cooking times are also doubled.

It can take up to 20 minutes for the InstaPot to come up to pressure before it starts pressure cooking.

Great idea to chop veggies ahead of time.

You can even cook the meat frozen!! Does not take any longer to cook. Woo hoooooo!!

Don't forget the pasta. Since it isn't done in the InstaPot, I almost forgot it!

If you are going to be cooking with the InstaPot most every night, buy more wooden spoons.

I would say that this is a definite "would cook again." I won't, however, double the recipe.





What's up next? Chili. Another Pinterest recipe. Stay tuned Pony faithful.
