



## **A Few Words from Club Members**

Well here we are with the second installation from our members. Hope you are enjoying the stories and the food. If others want to contribute, just send your ideas my way.

#### Paul Geise: The Band—Part 2: Kinda How It Started

It all started in Jr. High. 1st guitar was a white solid body electric. I talked Mom into buying it at a variety store. I bought a couple of chord books, listened to records (round vinyl discs with a hole in the center), and learned from friends. It was VERY hard to play as the strings were way too far from the fretboard. And, yes my fingers bled. I mowed lawns, walked dogs, weeded, and washed cars, to earn money. Bought a "VOX" teardrop shaped 6 string & a very small "VOX" amp (it had 1 whole knob!). Got together with some guys from church- Clark (bass), Larry (drums), Lynn guitar.

The next band was w/ Mickey. Mickey was actually a very good bass player but wanted to do songs by "The Birds". These required a 12-string. He had a 12-string so he played that & I played bass. Mickey was 2 or 3 years older than me and taught me a lot on the bass. Mike was the drummer and Lynn was once again the rhythm guitarist, & Donnie... something was the keyboardist. (Donnie wrote a song about Harry Houdini...It was called "Harry...Quit Playing In the Water...You'll Hurt Yourself"). Played some school & church dances, but the big deal was a "BATTLE OF THE BANDS!!" in Winnemucca, Nevada. It was at the National Guard Armory. As a stage they used 3 flat-bed trailers. One band would be setting up outside, while one band was playing inside, while the last band to play was breaking down When it was time to switch, they'd pull out one trailer and back in the next one, plug you in and away you'd go... actually pretty slick. We did NOT win, but some of us got arrested...I've been told not to go into details...

There were several bands between the "Winnemucca incident" and my first "road" band "Razz-Ma-Tazz". "Razz" was Steve H. ...guitar, Rod...vocals, Joey...drums, and me. We traveled in Rod's Chevy van and towed our equipment in a borrowed (Ok! Ok! ... stolen) U- haul trailer. (went through 2 or 3 sets of tires on that trailer) (also, got stopped once in Washington...thought uh-oh, they got us...but it was for expired tabs on the trailer. Got out of that one by getting our mgr. to tell the Nevada DOT he lost his tabs, paid \$5 for new ones and sent them to us...BINGO BONGO!)

My main bass through ALL the road bands was a 1964 Fender Precision. Loved that thing! My other basses (back ups) were all kinds of different brands & models. But I always gravitated back to the "64 P' bass.

We played some local "gigs", but our first road gig was "The

Golden Wheel Hotel" in Pocatello, Idaho. I was very excited! I believe we got paid \$500 (not each) plus rooms at the hotel. It was a big deal whenever we got free rooms, as motels were pretty spendy for 4-6 people for 1 or 2 weeks. We had 4 rooms that shared a bathroom between two rooms. When you sat on the toilet you could pass the time (and other things) by looking up and studying the plumbing on the floor above you as the ceiling had rotted away. CLASSY!!! The band that played there before us, we knew & was from Reno also. The guitar player's parents had come up to see them. The parents had gotten rooms at the hotel also and as a result, his Mom & Dad had caught "the crabs" from the bedding! (Did I mention...CLASSY!!!?)

The band would stay out on the road anywhere from 6 -12 weeks. Seeing as how the singer would sing almost every song 4 hours a night...minimum...5 nights a week, we had a tendency to go through singers pretty regularly. I would sing 3-4 songs a night just to give him a breather...but I was no lead singer. I would sing back-up & harmonize.

Once, we played for 3 nights at an NCO club on a base. Our drummer got very ill and we called Reno for a replacement. I think his name was Mitch. He was a decent drummer, just played too soft for a very loud rock & roll band. This drove Steve CRAZY! They would get into some pretty heated "discussions" I thought he was doing us a favor and we should make the best of it (after all it was only for 3 nights). The 1<sup>st</sup> night there weren't very many people there, but they seemed to like us. 2<sup>nd</sup> night the place was packed! We played very well, even w/ a replacement drummer! They put up with us at first, then they started to yell for "Funk". We were a R&R band, not a funk band and thus didn't have any funk material. Eventually, they got around to hating us, & the more they drank & the more we played, the rowdier they got. Finally at a break, I suggested we play "Superstitious" by Stevie Wonder, since we were familiar with it Rod didn't know the words but I knew most of them, so I sang what I could remember and slurred the rest. We opened the next set with it and the place went absolutely NUTS! Rod ...being the slick front man that he was... thanked them and said..."Now we're going to play something for you white folk!" Did I mention 90% of the crowd was African American? Well...it was!! My mouth fell open -Rod sauntered over to me and quietly said "Did I just say that?" I replied that I didn't know who he was and had never seen him before this. Then I quickly moved to the other side of the stage. Somehow we survived... I didn't talk to Rod for 2 weeks!

#### **InstaPot Adventures with Missy**

Welcome back for the second try with the new InstaPot. My first adventure was very successful. I am hoping that my second and third endeavors will be just as successful. Last month I promised you Chili. I found a Chili recipe on Pinterest that looked interesting, so I gave it a go. I've been searching recipes on Pinterest and I have saved 65 InstaPot recipes I want to try. I settled on Blue Ribbon Instant Pot Chili Recipe by Kathy from <a href="https://amomsimpression.com/instant-pot-chili-recipe/">https://amomsimpression.com/instant-pot-chili-recipe/</a>. This was different from the Past Fagioli soup in that there would be no soaking of the beans. She used canned beans. Ok. Again, another fairly simple, easy and super quick recipe.

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 15 minutes Total Time: 25 minutes

Servings: 4 Calories: 702

And no, I did not double the recipe this time.

#### Ingredients:

1 lb ground beef

½ cup chopped white onion

1 Tbl oil

2 cans 15.5 oz each, kidney beans, drained & rinsed

1 can 14.5 oz diced tomatoes

1 cup beef broth

1 Tbl chili powder

1 tsp garlic powder

1 tsp salt

1/2 tsp black pepper

2 tsp Worcestershire sauce

#### Instructions:

Add beef, onion & oil to instapot & sauté

Heat uncovered until meat is browned

Add remaining ingredients & mix well

Place lid & seal shut

Set to pressure cook, high pressure for 5 minutes

When cooking is complete, quick release steam & open

pot

Stir before serving top with shredded cheddar cheese

Again, cooking time does not include the time it takes for the

InstaPot to come to pressure before it begins to cook. But seriously, how can you beat homemade Chili in 5 minutes??

Take Aways: oops, I forgot I did double this recipe.

Dad says more beans.

Hardly any liquid needs LOTS more

Dad said it was ok, but had not much taste in terms of seasoning

I searched Safeway and for the life of me could not find tabasco anywhere. So I got the Mexican kind. I'm familiar with that with as much time as I spend with Miguel's family. Besides, Miguel says that "I'm rolling with the Mexicans now"! oh that kid! Dad added more beans and 3 drops of the Mexican tabasco. Too much.

This one was NOT a success. I am hoping Carroll Shelby can help me out the next time I make Chili in the InstaPot. Yes, you read that right. My Shelby friends Scott & Kristen told me that is all they have used for several years. So, I found the mix at Safeway and will try it next time.





Next up was Pork Fried Rice. When I was growing up my mom made delicious Pork Fried Rice. I think this was another Pinterest recipe. I will spare you all the details and simply leave you with this:

GO TO SAFEWAY. There's no picture of the finished product. It was way too much work. It tasted awful. Now I have ingredients I will never use again in my cabinets. I don't even like Jasmine rice! BIG FAIL on this attempt. I will NEVER make this again. Not kidding. Go to SAFE-WAY and buy theirs.

What's up next? Chicken Noodle Soup and an InstaPot cookbook! Stay tuned Pony faithful.

#### **MUKILTEO LLGHTHOUSE AND MUSEUM CRUISE**

#### Saturday, May 22, 2021

Located 60 miles north of Puyallup this lighthouse was officially "lit" in 1906 and remains in operations helping ferries and other boaters sail safely while traveling the waters of Possession Sound.
