Another sign that things are beginning to turn around for the positive, our museums are reopening!!!!!!





Daffodil Parade


April 10, 2021

To celebrate 2021 National Mustang Day, 29 members of the Pierce Country Mustang Club, including three new members who joined on the spot, cruised to the Northwest Carriage Museum in Raymond, WA, on Saturday, April 18, for an enjoyable step back in time look at a varied collection of restored horse-drawn carriages.

Executive Director Laurie Bowman, curator Jerry Bowman and their team organized an informative and entertaining program about the 58 19th-century horse-drawn carriages on display in the museum, including several original vehicles that were used in movie classics from the early 1900's. As he led the tour, Mr. Bowman explained how many of the technologies of the carriages were carried over to automobile production and how the related terminology still exists in the auto world today.

The warm sunny day proved to be a treat, along with club sponsored plusses: drivers received National Mustang Day window stick-

ers, conveniently attached to a bag of minicandy bars, prior to the cruise, and ten attendees won free admittance to the Museum via a club raffle. The cruise was organized by

A Few Words from Club Members

Well here we are with the second installation from our members. Hope you are enjoying the stories and the food. If others want to contribute, just send your ideas my way.

Paul Geise: The Band—Part 3:

The next band was "Thrust". We had a new singer (surprise – surprise) Bruce. He was from New York and was actually a pretty good singer. We also had a new drummer, Perry, who was from Spokane. Perry was a very good drummer (his bass drum was a converted parade drum!...Yes ... that's BIG!) plus he could sing. I bought an old Dodge van and we still had the "borrowed" U-Haul.

On our way from a gig in Minot, N.D. (where the motel had a sign not to drink the water and the water that came out of the shower was brown) to Casper, WY, we took a shorter route on the map as opposed to the Interstate. It looked like a good road and it was...except for the "SEVERE SIDE WINDS" sign. They were correct. The winds started whipping the trailer back & forth. Eventually, so much so, that I could actually read, in the side mirrors, the words "U-Haul-UHaul-Uhaul" that were on the side of the trailer!! The van got to rocking so hard that it woke everyone. Perry, who was on the floor asleep, looked up, saw the trailer, said "OH MY GOD!" and laid back down...I assume to pray...but I never asked. It was pretty scary! We finally made it to Casper. This gig had included rooms, also. The rooms were actually a small house. We thought-cool! Until, we noticed that three or four windows were completely broken out. Seeing this was winter, we decided we needed to stay somewhere else. We played 2 or 3 nights at the club when the owner came in (drunk on her keester) and fired us and everyone else in the club. This was the only time we ever got fired.

We played a lot at a club in Salt Lake City called the "Castile". There were a lot of "firsts" at the Castile. First (and only) time I was in tear gas, first (not the only) time I had a gun pulled on me (by a drunk at very close range), first time I had the worm gear in the steering column break just before getting on the freeway (watching the steering wheel just spinning around on its own is rather unnerving). OH, and best of all... being able to look directly into the girls bathroom (whenever the door opened) from the stage (also unnerving, but thrilling...at times).

The tear gas episode happened on Halloween night at The Castile. 2 or 3 weeks before, someone had fire bombed a club called "The City Dump". I think someone died and there were several injuries, so everyone was a little nervous. On Halloween night, the club (Castile) was packed...

absolutely jammed. It was so full we could hardly get off the stage (which was only about a foot high) during breaks. During one song a girl dancing in front of the stage (very inebriated) tripped and fell on the guitar players pedals. She was having trouble getting back up what with her "condition", her blouse open, her ample chest exposed to all, & a VERY pissed-off guitar player kicking her in the head! "Hey Steve...relax and see the sights!" That was the upside to the night...well that & the girls bathroom door was almost constantly open...YOWZA!

Around our 3rd set, the bouncer came up to me, asked us to stop playing, & announce that there was a problem at the front door and that everyone should leave out the back until the all clear. He said there was smoke at the entrance and they weren't sure what it was. (I didn't announce that part) I stopped the band and announced over our P.A. "Could I have your attention please...there is some trouble up front and we need to have you ALL exit behind the stage" So everyone, having drank a bit, immediately rushed to the front!! What happened was, someone tossed a military grade tear gas canister in the entryway and now everyone was walking into the gas cloud. I'm sure a lot of them had the "City Dump" episode on their mind. We (the band) and a few others went out the back. The drummer and I went back in to make sure everyone had gotten out, and sure enough we found a couple people so drunk they were almost passed out. So, we got them out. Tear gas is NASTY stuff, I had no idea! The fire dept. & police arrived to people crying and moaning in agony & throwing up all over the place. Whoever did it must have had some big kehones, because he tossed another one under the fire truck!! Needless to say that ended our night & the next. The fire department put huge fans in the club to help blow that stuff out. We went back the 3rd night & played 1 set but couldn't go on as the fumes were still so bad.

So that is my life on the road with a Rock & Roll band...and then I married a school administrator and so much for the fun.
