A New Meeting Location for PCMC

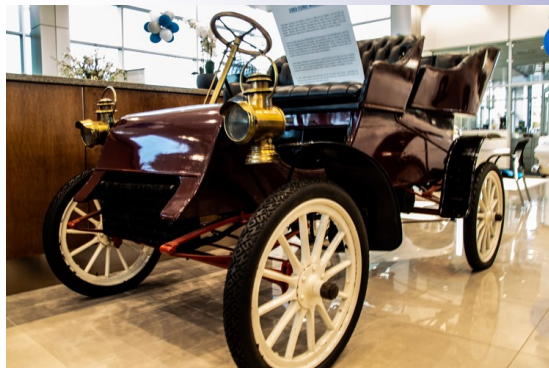

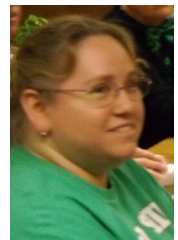

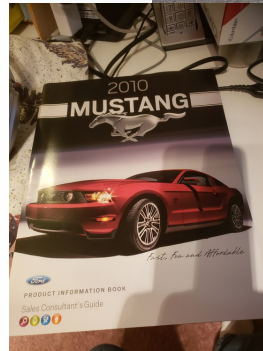
Purpose Statement

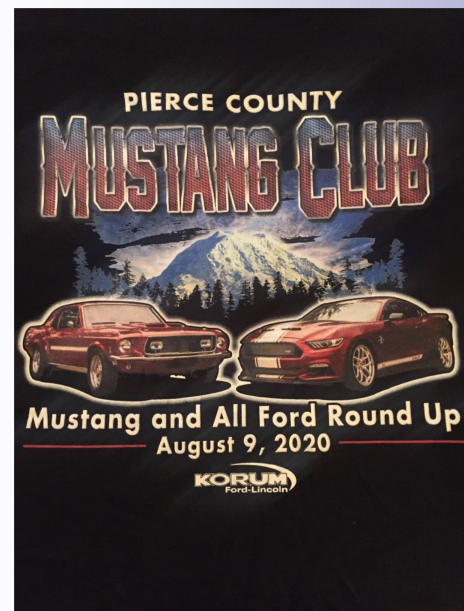

A Few Words from Club Members

Well here we are with the second installation from our members. Hope you are enjoying the stories and the food. If others want to contribute, just send your ideas my way.

Paul Geise: The Band—Part 4: ON TO FIVER

Our singer had quit (no news there) and the drummer, guitarist and I were looking for a replacement. We were hanging out in our manager's office waiting for one to "pop-up". OK... the other reason was because the doctor's office down the hall was the same doctor's office the ...uhhh... "working girls" from the "Mustang Bridge Ranch" would come to for their weekly check-up. Every Tuesday, a limo would pull up with 4 or 5 wonderful young (all right...some weren't so young...sue me!) girls and they would saunter past our manager's office. We, of course, would always sit by the door and say "HELLOOO" and other such smooth lines.

There was a guy, a pretty good singer & guitar player) by the name of Fred. He lived in this basement house (half above, half below ground) for years. He had a very small, sparse recording studio, and would write songs. He would ask musicians in town if they would lay down some tracks for him on those songs. We all had done this for him a few times, it was kind of fun. He would then mix the songs, record them on cassette tapes. Then, send them off to record companies.

One day when we were in our manager's office, (probably a Tuesday) Fred came in and was VERY excited! It seems one of the tapes he sent out got a positive response. He brought the letter with him and it was from Elton John's record company "Rocket Records". In it they said they liked the songs and wanted to come see his band. One problem...he had no band! Just a bunch of "happened to be in town" musicians ...but...here we three sat... looking for a singer. Being decent at math we all put our heads together and came up with $3+1=$...wait for it...4!! About that time another band had just broken up and we acquired the keyboard player, who was also a very good singer...we'll call him Hat ... mainly because...well... that's what we called him. Now we were a 5-some and that's probably where you think we got our name. WRONGOOO!! We...(we being Fred)... his letter of interest, his songs... you figure it out... got it from a character in a book titled "Watership Down. Fiver was the rabbit. I read the book and thought it was a piece of well... excrement...

We got together 2 or 3 times to learn his songs. After a couple days our manager came to us and asked if we wanted to play a 1 night gig? We said sure...knowing we could pull together enough cover tunes for one night. He said "good". What he didn't tell us until the next day, was that it was in 10 days, opening for "Foghat" in Medford Or. And they wanted 45 minutes of original material! Uh....OH! Fred only had 4 or 5 completed songs. He had some songs without words and some just partials. We went to work and finally got JUST 45 min. worth. Off to Medford we went. When you are the opening act a couple of things go along with that job. First, you don't get paid much, if anything at all. Second you're called "The Dummy Band" because you warm up the "dummies" in the audience (I also think it's because you

agreed to drive several hundred miles, stay in a motel, pay for food ...all while not getting paid!). Third, It's totally up to the big name band whether (or how many) lights & monitors you get during your time on stage. The less they give you, the better the big name band sounds. Foghat was VERY cool however & let us have a lot of lights (not all & no spot lights) and some very good side monitors to hear yourself sing. During the sound check, they went first. The lead guitarist, at one point, stumbled to the edge of the stage. He looked like he was either stoned or was very dizzy. Anyway, he fell off the stage (it was 5 or 6 feet high) but, luckily the stage hands (roadies) caught him! All the managers and promoters ran over, VERY concerned. As they were all gathering around in horror, he popped up & said something like "GOTCHA, A...Holes!" it was pretty funny.

Now it's time to go on. The National Guard Armory was packed. They estimated 5 or 6 thousand! Biggest crowd I ever played for. Was I nervous?... oh yeah!... as was everyone else. So, we're into the first song, and it's time for Fred to sing. What we didn't realize was that he hadn't sang before an audience...let alone one as big as this! He froze! I had to nudge him up to the mike, and he started singing. The whole set, he hardly moved...just stood there rather frozen. The rest of us took about a minute to get over our stage fright and decided, HEY THIS IS PRETTY COOL!!!, and we really got into it.

We end our set to a very nice round of applause, and go back stage. The stage manager comes back to our little dressing room and says "Hey...they want an encore, congratulations...now get back out there! Problem...we only had rehearsed those 45 minutes of songs!! We had no encore, mainly because the "dummy" band never gets one (the audience is there for the main act...NOT you), the main act doesn't want you to have one as it may show them up, and it throws off the schedule. But...here we were! We quickly conferred and decided we all knew "Jumpin' Jack Flash" and that the keyboardist would come out front to sing it. That was the first time we had played "JJF"...right there at that time in front of thousands. At one point I looked over back-stage and saw Foghat watching us and getting into it. They later thanked us and told us they really liked the set. It was VERY cool!

So that is my life on the road with a Rock & Roll band...and then I married a school administrator and so much for the fun.

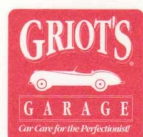
