Jack & Joi Curtis 2006 Tungsten Grey GT



Happy 2022! I am Jack Curtis along with my wife Joi we are relatively new to Pierce County Mustang Club. We joined in February 2021. We really enjoy the camaraderie of the Mustang community.

I have been a "Ford guy" from the beginning. My first car was a 1965 F 100 with a 240 straight 6 and a 4 speed manual transmission. Since then I have had quite a few Ford trucks, an Escort, Tempo even a 1986 full size Bronco. The Bronco was the money pit from hell but I wish I still had it. And now, along with our Mustang I have a 2000 F 250 with the 7.3L diesel. My first experience with a Mustang was in Yakima at a used car lot. There was a

1970 Boss 302 in grabber yellow. The salesman took me out for a test drive, he didn't let me drive it but it did not matter. When he put it in first and laid rubber and into second and put some more rubber on the pavement I was hooked. That was in 1986 and I've wanted a Mustang ever since. By the way he wanted \$13,000 for it but making 3 bucks an hour that was out of my price range. I just wished I had a crystal ball telling me how much it be worth today then the 13K would have been a steal.

Our baby is a 2006 GT! It is tungsten grey with black interior. She joined our garage in October of 2020. In late spring of 2020 my wife, Joi told me that she was thinking of selling her Hyundai Veloster and getting a Mustang. I didn't think much about it, I just thought she was making small talk and wasn't really serious. Then in August she brought it up again and I asked me what I thought about it. I told her that I liked the 67 through 70 Mustangs really well and they were the best looking of the cars. She said that was a little too old for her. I told her how I loved S-197's (although I didn't know that was what they were called) because Ford brought together the classic style with a modern look. I really love the look of the 05-09's Mustangs. So I started looking on Craigslist to see what was out there and in October we found "Susan" in Eatonville. So we brought her home, Joi let me drive her, she gave me the keys and said Happy Birthday. I could not believe it! I was absolutely speechless.

Our Mustang has been given the name Susan. Our family has been naming our cars for 20 years or more. How we came up with the name I don't know, I just knew it was not going to be Sally, no offense Mr Pickett. Since getting her I have put BBK shorty headers on, a rear window louver, new interior door panels, an intake manifold plenum, trunk release button and a front strut tower brace. She came already lowered sporting CS-67 wheels and a K and N cold air intake. I haven't done any engine modifications and don't know if I will. I do know that I absolutely love her and have no intentions of getting rid of her and hopefully she will go to my grandson. He is 4 so that won't be awhile.
