ay, Spring is here! April - a month of holidays, celebrations, and events. April 17th is a special day, it's National Mustang Day. I think it is awesome that we have a national day for our beloved Mustangs!

I'm sure most of you know the history of the Mustang but I would like to summarize some history of how this day came about.

Picture it....It was April of 1964, the World's Fair was open and being enjoyed by thousands of people, and Ford decided it was the best time to introduce to the world their newest muscle car, the Mustang. They nicknamed it the "Pony Car", the first of its kind.

The Pony car, with its sleek lines, is a small, sporty car, at an affordable price. It gave the family man a way to feel and look "cool" and mom could use it as a family car. Whether we owned a Mustang or not, those sleek lines, powerful engine, and exhaust noises made us think of wild times, summer, nighttime drives, cruising through downtown, and youthful misadventures. With its popularity, the Mustang also became a popular fixture on movie sets. James Bond drove one in the *Goldfinger* movie, and there were many, many more cameo appearances for the Mustang throughout the years.

The Mustang quickly became the American favorite muscle car by beating out the Thunderbird with over 400,000 sales in the first year. It was so popular that over 500 Mustang clubs were formed within 3 years of the first production. Here we are...60 years later and over 9 million have been sold.

April 17th of every year is designated as National Ford Mustang Day. A day given to us "fan"atics to celebrate the car, the myth, the legend! It's a day to remember why we love this car so much, its history and the true American classic that it is. National Mustang Day gives us an opportunity to appreciate American engineering and the constantly evolving automotive industry. There are many events, festivals, and celebrations all over the world to honor this car. You can do a simple web search to find these events.

Here at PCMC we are going to celebrate by going on a day-cruise. Our celebration is on April 2nd because Easter is on April 17th and the Daffodil Parade is April 9th. So, April 2nd it is! We will take our Pony's for an epic ride to Westport, WA. It will be a day of fresh air, sunshine (think positive), ocean breezes, and a scavenger hunt! We will end (or is it START) the party at the Westport Winery Garden resort.

Fleischbein and a clock went to Chris Yackel. The other awards


were Best Poker hand-Joi Curtis, 2nd best – Pete Freeman, and 3rd best hand – Sandy Fleischbein. We also gave awards for the

Thanks to all who participated and hope all enjoyed the day of the Green with us.








