Club Meeting Minutes—February 15, 2022 (Titus-Will & Zoom)



PCMC General Club Meeting Minutes for February 15, 2022

6:00 Call to Order

Welcome & Introductions/Sandy

Sandy welcomed everyone and opened the floor for introductions; three members attended via Zoom.

Announcements & Acknowledgments/Sandy

Sandy congratulated the February Mustang of the Month owners Pete and Nancy Freeman, whose names were drawn at the January meeting. Sandy thanked the Freemans for hosting the car club meeting and for serving dinner to those attending the meeting. She also thanked Monika for leading the cruise to the Museum of Flight.

Club Business

Previous month's General meeting Minutes /Sandy

Sandy requested a motion to approve the minutes of the previous general meeting. Pam made the motion; it was seconded by Paul, and the motion carried.

January 2022 Treasurer's Report/Nancy

Nancy reported on the period of January 18, 2022 -- February 14, 2022. The car show received \$400 income as a member's company elected to sponsor the dash plaques; the car show did not have any expenses. She reviewed the income and expenses for the general fund. She explained the pass-through income/expense related to the purchase of the club vests and jackets; all jackets/vests ordered have been paid for. She said one reason the month shows a loss is because \$900 of the jacket/vest money was deposited last month but the invoice for the purchases was not paid until this month. She noted the insurance costs for the Property Protection for the storage shed contents (\$300 to \$361) and the General Liability (\$385 to \$484) had increased this year.

Profit/loss YTD \$ 1,974.83

Ending Balance 2/14/2022 \$12,173.57

Hank moved to accept the report as presented; the motion was seconded by Steve. Motion carried.

Membership /Nancy

Nancy reported that to date 60 renewal and 1 new membership dues have been paid; last year, 92 memberships were paid. She said she had completed

paperwork for the club to receive a President's Award from the MCA for the charitable, show, and other activities for the previous year. She said the club needed 100 combined points for the activities and PCMC had more than 200 points earned. Nancy also completed the paperwork for the PCMC's renewal as a Regional Club for MCA. Some discussion followed concerning the club receiving credit for members showing their cars at other regional MCA shows. A question was asked concerning PCMC receiving credit for the individual members of our club being members of the MCA. Nancy said yes, and that she needed the MCA membership numbers for any our members who joined MCA so that the club could receive points. A question was asked if the club would have decals for National Mustang Day. Nancy said yes. Missy said she already had the decals and would distribute them at National Mustang Day Cruise.

Jackets/Vests/Nancy

Nancy said the order is completely paid for, and almost 100% delivered. The order is closed. Pete modeled one of the new vests to a general murmur of approval.

New Year's Party/Sandy

Sandy thanked the party committee of Missy, Karen and Harley for their work. Missy said almost everyone who RSVP'd did come and everyone seemed to have a good time. Several attendees thanked them for their work and said they enjoyed the party. Laurie noted the only downside was the long wait time in line to order. Some discussion followed concerning Sizzler's failure to have capability to move the line quickly with the gift cards. Short discussion followed as to whether the club should revert to a December party in 2022, or have the January party again in January 2023. No action was taken.

Museum of Flight Cruise/Monika

Monika reported seven cars participated in the cruise and everything was fine.

Committee Reports

Daffodil Parade/Heidi

Heidi reported she had been in communication with the parade organizers for the April 9 event. The PCMC is not needed this year to provide transport/escort for VIPs, except as a possible backup for Marymount. Discussion followed concerning the role the club wants to play in this year's event, specifically, should the club participate at all and should the club participate but not provide any back up VIP service.

Costs for participation were discussed as not providing VIP service means paying the entrance fee for the club. Heidi offered the following options—

- a) Attend as a group and be the planned backup for the VIP transport
- b) Pay the \$25 fee for the group to just be in the parade and not provide any VIP services
- c) Not be in the parade at all

A discussion followed concerning previous experiences club members have had providing VIP services. Paul said that if the club voted to provide VIP services under option a, the parade organizers should be required to have a drop-dead date one way or the other as to whether club members would be needed to drive the VIPs. Heidi agreed.

Heidi asked for a show of hands for option a; four members voted for option a. Heidi asked for a show of hands for option b; nine members voted for option b. No vote was taken for option c due to the option b results. She said to not be surprised if the parade organizers turn up at the group gathering place to ask someone last minute to be a VIP carrier anyway. She said she expects it to happen. She said she will advise the organizers of the club's decision.

Car Show Planning Report/Missy

Missy said work continues; the committee needs a Registration Chair (Pam is taking care of pre-registration), a General Raffle Chair (volunteers are in place to work for the chair), and a Trivia Contest Chair. Nora volunteered to be the Trivia Contest Chair.

Missy said the t-shirt design and color (dark heather gray) are confirmed for this year and pre-orders will be taken through March 15 at the price of \$23 each. Tanks and V-necks will only be available by pre-order. She hopes to distribute pre orders at the April meeting. Once preordering has closed, the t-shirts will only be available in the one style and will sell for \$25.

Missy said more items are needed for the goody bags, and matchbox cars are needed for the children's goody bags. Nancy said she will get a list of needed items to Steve for the newsletter. Discussion followed concerning the count (80) of the bags and the usual contents.

Missy also said sponsorships are still needed.

Upcoming Events/Activities/Various

FNDO is this Friday, 2/18, at Famous Dave's in Tacoma.

Monika reported that she has talked with them and will call them again before Friday. She said to expect very slow service as the restaurant is chronically understaffed.

Missy said the Car Show meeting for next month will be at Karen and Harley's house and will include dinner, probably pizza.

Jerry said the plans for the March St. Patrick's Day Poker Cruise are underway and he has everything ready. He said the cruise will take a couple of hours and will include several stops for the distribution of the poker cards. The cruise will begin at the Park and Ride Parking Lot behind McDonald's at Hwy. 512 and end at a family restaurant for lunch and awards. He said children are welcome to the cruise and he will have some awards for them as well.

Missy said the National Mustang Day Cruise will take place on April 2 rather than the actual National Mustang Day because the day falls on Easter. She said the cruise will be to the winery in Westport and will include a scavenger hunt along the way. She and Clay are working out the details and Robert is helping with planning the route.

Mustang of the Month/Jerry

Jerry drew for the Mustang of the Month for March; members Leon and Tana Johnson of Puyallup were chosen. Leon was present via Zoom. They have a 2014 Ruby Red Convertible. Jerry said he would mail them a note.

Raffle Drawing/Nora

Nora reported the raffle item count had increased by the donation of a few items prior to the beginning of the meeting. It was Ray's lucky night as he won three of the raffle draws; prizes were also won by Karen, Fran, Mark, Monika and Dale.

Heidi reminded everyone that it is not too early to think about buying your tickets for the club's attendance at a Rainer's game later in the year.

2014 Mustang Premium Ruby Red Convertible

I remember it well. The year was 1969, and I was just twenty years old. A civil service position at Central Washington State College as it was known back then, in Ellensburg, put cash in my pocket, so I headed to Kelleher Motors. There it was—a brand new 1969 jade green Mustang notchback with a Windsor 351. Tana and I were married in 1975. In 1976, we sold the '69 Mustang for a more appropriate family car. There were 130,000 miles on that car, so I tried to balance the value of the car based on years and mileage to determine the best time to sell it. A high school kid bought it for \$1,350. He drove the daylights out of it.



For years after that I dreamed of having another Mustang, but sensibility seemed to always win out. Hundreds of times over the years, I looked at Mustangs on Craigslist—not to buy necessarily, but to daydream about. One day in June, 2019, there I was at my home office computer looking at Mustangs. That's when Tana caught me looking again. "So, you're looking at Mustangs again," she said. Yes, I had been. "Why don't you just go buy one," she continued?



"What kind shall we buy," I asked. Now Tana is pretty conservative fiscally, so I was shocked at her response. "A convertible, of course," she answered. So the hunt was on. It had to be a ruby red convertible with premium trim. In a nationwide search, we found our 2014 Mustang Premium with 305HP V-6 in Phoenix, AZ for \$14,500 with just 30,000 miles. There was no dickering. That was the price. We got 30mpg on the way home.

We grabbed some Southwest tickets from our son-in-law who flies for SW and arrived just in time to make the

deal before the dealer closed. This Mustang rode rough! Real rough! I wondered if I'd made a mistake. It was as if gravity had been multiplied tenfold. We felt every crack in the road all the way back to Washington. It was great fun stopping for gas with many people wanting to talk about our car and their own Mustang experiences. After we arrived home, I discovered the 3-suspension settings control on the steering wheel. What a relief that was.

We've enjoyed many great drives, especially during Covid-19 when we were mostly housebound. It was great to explore with the top down to many locations in east Pierce and King Counties as well as a trip to Snoqualmie Falls. It's also been great fun to participate in several club cruises.



I don't think I'm quite finished with our Mustang history. We just returned from Palm Springs where I stumbled onto a 2018 ruby red premium convertible eco-boost with just 13,500 miles at a Ford dealership for \$36,900. They were not in a dickering mood. It had a full gauge package including enhanced brakes, GT wheels, heated/cooled seats and climate control. We drove it since the salesman insisted, of course. Fantastic! We all know this is not the time to buy a used car. Besides, this was a road trip, which would have meant driving home in separate cars.

Yep, I'm still a Mustang guy!
