

Poets and song writers sometimes write about love found at an early age—a love that might wax and wane over the years but never quite goes away. Mustang owners understand this kind of attraction and Hank Deck is no exception.

His first Mustang love, acquired in 1970 for \$900 when a sophomore at Bowling Green University subsisting on SpaghettiOs totted up with hamburger, was a 1966 plainest-of-the-Janes black, 6-cylinder, 3-speed. This affair was ultimately defeated by the car's inability to keep a working heater core in the freezing Buffalo, NY, winter of 1974.

He had a series of cars following, including flings with two corvettes, before settling



into his forties with a nice Lincoln sedan. A mild-flirtation accompanied the Lincoln in 2000 when he purchased a 1966 in serious need of restoration. The work had just begun when a corporate change of plans forced a move and the would-have-been-a-beautiful-blue love had to be sold.

By 2014, the Lincoln line no longer appealed, and it was time to return to the beginning. He bought a 2014 race-red premium coupe

and joined the Pierce County Mustang Club—two good decisions. She certainly totted up the garage.

During the 2020 Covid year, Hank and wife Margie spent a lot of time just driving. The red love looked great but didn't provide the most comfortable ride in the passenger seat, and all that motoring about included conversation about the attributes of a convertible—a plus absent since Margie had sold her Saturn Sky.

Conversation led to searching the web and after a lot of swiping left the new *one* was found in February 2021: the garage now boasts a much-admired 2020 silver Eco Boost Premium convertible. How long will she stay? It is hard to say. Mustang lovers are devoted but often suffer from a roaming eye.




