



2015 50 Year Anniversary GT Premium Convertible

My love for cars was sparked at an early age while my dad was out in the driveway under one of the various, now vintage cars, and I was tasked with passing him the tools. There were countless warm summer days, playing eye spy or counting cars between mile markers as we drove his restored 1957 Ford Fairlane with its creme-colored body and black accents to the junk yard to pick for parts of whatever car he was restoring at the time. When not tasked as his little grease monkey assistant, my sister and I took advantage of the time off to play throughout the cars and would always come to some sort of disagreement as to who would be in the drivers seat. The features of the classic cars were what always stuck out to me. I always admired the sharp angles of the fins on a Bel Air or the rounded back of an Oldsmobile.

As I got older and started to develop a taste in cars, my eye would always land on the Mustang due to the stocky frontend and sleek design of the tail lights. Unfortunately, throughout my teens and into adulthood, I let my interest in cars wane to a point where purchasing a muscle car was not on my mind while search for my next automobile. I took their advice and started scouring the different options for purchasing my next Mustang and finally landed on my dream car, a deep impact blue 2015 50 Year Anniversary GT Premium Convertible with customized Seahawks decals. I was in love.

My dad loved the Seahawks and I know that he would have loved this car as much as me. He shaped my love for sports and I know that we would have gone to a game or two in it just to say that we did. I am grateful for the times that I got to sit and watch the Seahawks wipe the turf with a visiting team as the stadium roared we would be roar with them.

I am sad to say that my dad passed away in 2013 a month or two into the season that the Seahawks made it to and won the Super Bowl XLVIII. I know that anyone with a Mustang is able to trace back their love for the car to specific memories as they grew up or shared experiences with a loved one and I am glad to say that I am one of those people. When I found this car, it was hard not to imagine that my father and I would be going to shows today to see all the beautiful cars on display and riding with the top down in the cruises that the clubs put on.

I am so excited to have joined the Pierce County Mustang Club and the Mustang Mama's due to the generous members and engaging events that each club has throughout the year. I didn't know that I would have enjoyed myself so much when I first started my search for a Mustang but I am glad to have met the amazing people that I have and seen some really exceptionally nice cars.
